



Choosing Life

She was 17 years old, enjoying herself on a date with an older boy. Until the boy decided not to take no for an answer. The shame and guilt were overwhelming and she could not talk about it with anyone – until a month later when she realized she was pregnant.

The girl had two options: get an abortion or be sent away to a home for unwed mothers, have the baby and give the baby up for adoption. She chose the second option.

When the baby was born, the girl was told her baby was a boy who was very sick and would probably not live. She named her son James Edward: James after her brother, Edward after her father. The girl was not allowed to see her son. All her life she wondered: Did he live? If he did live, did he have a good life? If only she could find and meet him! That never happened.

Well, that mother was my mother too. A few years before she passed, my mother shared this story with me and my brother and sister. How shocked and saddened we were to hear that, not only had our mother been raped, but that her first born child, our brother, probably died shortly after birth.

Fast forward to two years ago. I was contacted by a man who said he had gone through DNA testing and was told that I and my siblings might be his cousins. After talking with him and sharing each other's stories and pictures, I told him: "Jim, I don't think we are cousins – I think we are brothers." A fact confirmed when we petitioned New York State for Jim's birth records. JIM IS MY OLDER BROTHER I NEVER KNEW I HAD!

For the past 2 years, we four siblings and our spouses have gotten together on numerous occasions. Jim and his wife Beckie and their family live in the Detroit area. It has been a fabulous experience sharing stories and pictures and being able to tell Jim all about the woman who chose to give him life.

The weekend before Thanksgiving, we four siblings and our spouses will spend the weekend together in the Cleveland Area. We have rented a house where we can prepare a turkey dinner. With our ages ranging from 58 to 72, we will celebrate our second Thanksgiving together.

We have so much to be thankful for. Not the least of which – we are thankful that our mother chose life!
