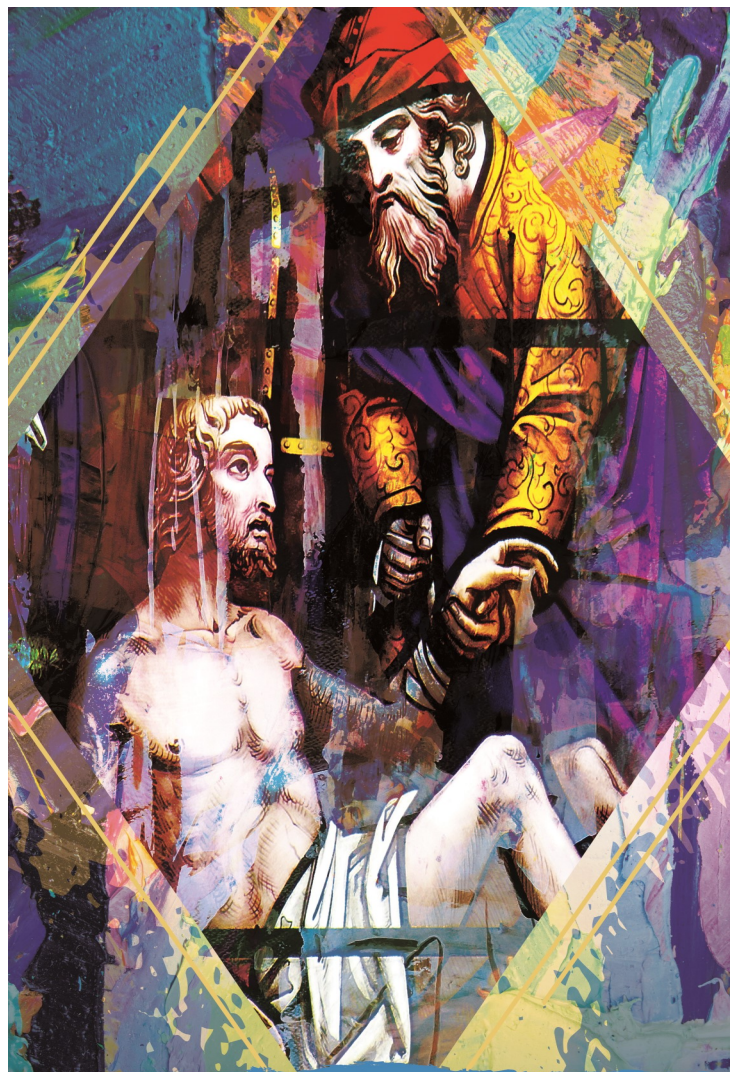

Reception of Holy Communion for parishioners with gluten intolerance

Since gluten-free hosts are considered *invalid matter* for Mass, our parish provides **LOW-GLUTEN** hosts for those parishioners with gluten intolerance.

Please, pay attention to the following indications:

If you want to receive a whole low-gluten host or just a small piece, please, let the sacristan know before Mass begins. A pyx with your host will be prepared. Be aware that the priest will only consecrate the host that is requested by you at each Mass you attend.

If you cannot tolerate even low-gluten hosts, another option is to receive the consecrated wine which also contains fully the eucharistic presence of the Lord. The sacristan will prepare a separate cup for you.

Be aware that we are doing the best we can to attend your spiritual and sacramental needs. If you need more guidance on this matter, please, consult with Fr. Carlos.

Dear Friends,

This is my third week in St Martin de Porres Parish. I have been really busy these days meeting people, attending meetings, learning more about the community, cleaning out the rectory. Parishioners have been very generous and kind. I am so grateful and blessed. Thank you all for your continued support.

Today we celebrate the Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time and the gospel we read in Mass is one of my favorites; Jesus tells the parable of the good Samaritan. A very simple story that reminds us of our call and responsibility to take care of others, to "*be a neighbor to our brothers and sisters*". We are the neighbor to others when we recognize their dignity and value as human beings. This is the center of Jesus' preaching and ministry. The most important aspect of our relationships is to recognize that every single person has a dignity, no matter his/her background, race, sexual inclination, economic status, age, religion, social and political position. Every single person in this world deserves our love, our compassion, our help. Why? Because we firstly love God, because we have received His love and mercy, something we do not deserve.

St Paul in his letter to the Colossians today begins by claiming, "*Christ Jesus is the image of the invisible God.*" I would say that every single person, especially those who suffer, is the image of Jesus, the image of the invisible God.

Therefore, to "*Love God with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength and with all your mind*" means to see His merciful and compassionate face on those who are suffering, it means to see the face of Jesus on everybody. I continue to pray that our community may become a place where people feel safe, supported and loved.

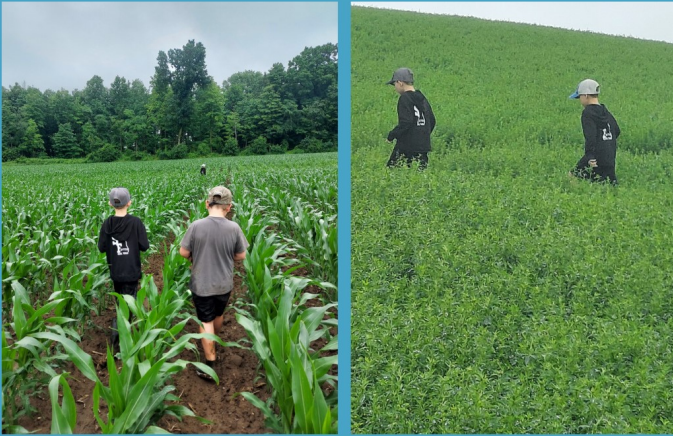
Summer Family Faith Bingo Challenge
