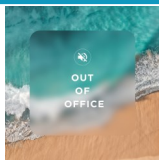

Dear Friends,

In an effort to be transparent with the parish dealings, I thought it important that I share with you a recent business transaction.

As far back as 40 years ago a parcel of land on Bridgeman Rd. was bequeathed to the then parish St. Vincent de Paul in Churchville. Due to some extenuating circumstances, it was difficult to sell the land – until recently and said circumstances have been addressed.

Whenever a church sells anything that it owns (such as land) it first has to go through the Diocesan Presbyterate Board and bishop for approval. Each case must be looked into and can take a fair amount of time. To its credit, this is the diocese doing its due diligence and is made known by decree for anyone to read.

Our parish, having received the aforementioned decree this week, allows the attorneys involved to get the paperwork in order so we can close. The amount the land has been sold for is \$185,000.

Eucharistic Revival

Definition from [The Baltimore Catechism](#):

"A **sacrament** is an outward sign instituted by Christ to give **grace**."
The greatest gift that God can give us is the gift of God's very self. Karl Rahner and other theologians speak of **grace** as "**God's personal self-communication**."
Grace is not so much **something** that is given but **someone** who is experienced as **present**. This is why many theologians today do not speak so much of **sacraments** "**giving grace**" but as sacramental celebrations "**enabling us to experience grace**," to touch **grace** itself, to contact the all-pervading **presence** of the loving God who sustains all created things in existence. The **sacraments** allow us to become conscious and aware of God's greatest gift: the creative, sustaining, loving **presence** of God. Our understanding of **sacrament** is related to our ideas of **grace** and **presence**. Not only the Eucharist, but each of the **sacraments** is a celebration of **God's real presence**.

CARE OF THE SICK: Please call the church office if you will be in the hospital, are not able to attend Mass and would like communion, or if you would like prayers.

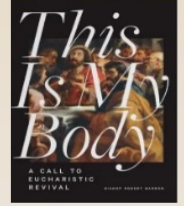
