Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of both fasting and abstinence. All other Fridays during the season of Lent are days of abstinence.


Abstinence:

Every person 14 years of age or older must abstain from meat (and items made with meat) on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent.

Fasting:

Every person, ages 18-59 must fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting refers to eating only one full meal a day with small portions that do not constitute a full meal at the other two mealtimes.




