



Pope Francis will visit the women's prison at the Rebibbia correctional facility in Rome on Holy Thursday to celebrate the Mass of the Lord's Supper with people housed there and those who work at the facility. The Vatican made the announcement March 6, according to the *National Catholic Reporter*, which also reported that this continues a custom Pope Francis has practiced since the start of his pontificate in 2013. Last year, Francis visited a juvenile detention facility where he washed, dried and kissed the feet of 12 people.

Jesus said, "If I, therefore, the master and teacher, have washed your feet, you ought to wash one another's feet. I have given you a model to follow so that as I have done for you, you should also do." The ceremony of washing another's feet -- which follows the Gospel account of Jesus washing the feet of his 12 disciples -- "is not something folkloric," the pope said during Holy Thursday Mass in 2023. It is a gesture that shows "how we are to be with one another."

At our own Holy Thursday Mass this year, (St. Mary of the Assumption Church in Scottsville, at 7 pm) Father John, Deacon Pat and Deacon Matt will wash the feet of parishioners, following Jesus's example.
