

Holy Week

“Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation.” 2 Cor 5:17. Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, in this Lenten season through prayer, arms giving and fasting we prepared ourselves for the Paschal Triduum of passion, crucifixion, death and resurrection of the Lord Jesus. We share in the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus through baptism. Our celebration of the Paschal Triduum, what we call the Holy Week, leading up to easter season should really be part of our daily life. It becomes our spirituality and not just a seasonal engagement. In baptism and reconciliation, we hope to live differently in God and in Jesus Christ. The old things have passed away. When we say old things, it does not mean old in terms of age but it is associated with sinfulness. The ways, lifestyle, attitude, priorities that destroy our relationship with God, relationship with our neighbors, whole society and creation. The old has passed away and new has come. When we say new, it does not mean modern or most recent, but it means, new existence, new order, new person, new humanity which Jesus Christ brings to us. St Paul connects it beautifully with baptism, the passing of the old and coming of the new. He says in his letter to Romans chapter 6, “you baptized must consider yourselves dead to sin but alive for God in Christ Jesus.” Those who will attend Easter vigil and Easter Sunday Mass, will experience the renewal of our baptismal promises but in summary to be baptized mean, dead to sin and alive for God. Thanks to the death and resurrection of Jesus and thanks to the Holy Spirit through whom we share in the death to sin and life in God given to us by the Paschal mystery of Jesus. Fr. Nadeem Yaqoob.
