Encouragement From Pastor Peter

"Being a Part of God's Family"

On July 14, 2025, the world lost an incredible servant, preacher, and pastor in Dr. John MacArthur. He was 86 years old. Dr. MacArthur was



widely known for his pastoral leadership (serving at Grace Community Church in Sun Valley, CA since 1969 – that's over 55 years!); commitment to biblical and expositional preaching; the production of the MacArthur Study Bible; Grace to You Ministries; the Master's Seminary; and his commitment to doctrinal

integrity. I was first exposed to John MacArthur's ministry while a Bible college student as a teenager, and I have been deeply impacted by his commitment to Scripture; his devotedness to the body of Christ; and his strong, unwavering conviction for biblical preaching and living. One of the sermons that he preached that influenced my life and shaped my view of the local church was titled "Why Church Membership Matters." This message shaped my heart into understanding the importance of being a part of the body of Christ at the highest level possible. Jesus bought the church with His blood. He loved the church insomuch that He gave His life for her (Acts 20:28; 1 Cor. 6:20). He gave us the fellowship of the church to fulfill the Great Commission; to house our community of faith; and to deepen our relationship with Him through discipleship. I do not know what I would do without the family of God.

Recently, PBC has been blessed to see several new families join our fellowship, visit our worship services, and be a part of what God is doing here. We rejoice in the Lord for adding to His church, but why is it so important that we are a part of the family of God? I want to share with you five reasons that Dr. MacArthur inspired many years ago that are still deeply relevant today. I write this article as a tribute to his life and ministry.

1. When you are a part of the local church, you are a visible witness of the Gospel at work in you and through you to the rest of the world.

Jesus has changed my life. My life is hidden in Him, therefore I identify with Him, I share in that fellowship, and I believe that He is worthy of not only my following, but also of my fellowshipping with like-minded believers (Colossians 3:3). Being a part of the church is a witness to the rest of the world that we are Jesus' disciples. Joining the local church is connecting yourself to His body & His blueprint for reaching the world. Jesus never instructed us to go solo with reaching the world for His glory. He has always done it through the vehicle of the local church (Matthew 16:18; Matthew 28:18-20).

2. When you are a part of the local church, you get to serve the Lord together.

Every member of the church family matters. God has saved you, and His Spirit has gifted you and placed you to serve in this body, and you are needed, wanted, and appreciated (1 Corinthians 12). Every believer is gifted by God to serve others. We are without excuse to not be a part of this great work as we consider the infinite opportunities before us to serve the Lord at PBC. And when we do get to serve the Lord together, it's an incredible blessing. These experiences build your faith, your trust, friendship, and grows you from family member to family member.

John MacArthur stated, "Apart from ministering our gift in the service of the Lord, our life on earth is worthless. Our sole purpose as Christians is to obey and serve the Lord through the gift with which He has uniquely blessed each of us, so that the body may be built up to be effective in evangelism." (MacArthur, *2 Timothy*, Moody, 1995).

3. When you are a part of a local church, you can have the opportunity to grow spiritually with one another.

The early church "devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread, and to prayers" (Acts 2:41-42). Growth comes in many ways. For some, it comes by sitting still, listening to God's Truth, and truly being matured in the faith. For others, growth comes by being entrusted with leadership and service opportunities. For everyone, there are opportunities to invest time into one another, hearing one another's stories/testimonies, praying for each other, rejoicing and even weeping as another struggles. The ministry of presence is powerful. It takes devotion, desire, and a heart for a deeper walk with the Lord and with one another to see this kind of growth.

4. When you are a part of a local church, you can have the opportunity to preserve, protect, and pass on sound doctrine from one generation to the next.

I realize that this reason for the importance of being part of a church family could easily get left behind, but doctrinal purity and integrity matters deeply. Who we are is important as a church; what we mean to this community is important; what we focus on is important; who we reach is important, but I would argue that what we believe and what we proclaim is what holds all of the previously mentioned together. The Word of God is powerful. It's life changing. Its truth is eternal, edifying, and equipping. Let us not waver in our devotion to sound doctrine. The Gospel is the greatest message we could ever proclaim and everything that is taught beyond our salvation should be sound, structured, and Spirit-filled. We are living in a time when people will not endure sound teaching and will want to suit their own desires, hearing teachers who just want to make them feel good about themselves and stay away from the truth that they don't like or agree with (paraphrase of 2 Timothy 4). We have a charge to preach and teach the Word and to maintain doctrinal integrity. Let us not just hear the Word but do it. And let us be sure to make sure that our biblical foundation is never compromised. I have always appreciated Pittsboro Baptist's focus on sound doctrine. There are many things that could be said of our congregation, but I pray that we will always be a family of believers built on God's unchanging truth.

5. Last, when you are a part of the local church, you are giving the world a preview of heaven on earth.

When people think of our church family, do they think of us being a glimpse of heaven on earth? We should want to see God's kingdom advance. We should want to see His purposes flourish. We should want to see His people grow; we should want to see lives changed. We should rejoice when sinners come to repentance and when salvation is brought to lost hearts, and when the church is revived. We should want to see the sick healed, the home restored, and the broken mended. That's what Jesus did for me, for you, and for countless others who have been reached and who are to be reached. I lové MacArthur wrote, "The church should be like a preview of heaven. The apostle Paul wrote of 'the household of God, which is the church of the living God, the pillar and support of the truth' (1 Tim. 3:15). More than any other institution on earth, the church is where the truth of God is upheld. The church is called to lift up the truth and hold it high. Employing the truth as a weapon, we are to smash the ideological fortresses of Satan's lies (2 Cor. 10:3-5). And it is in the pursuit of that goal that the church will ultimately realize her greatest triumph. "All of that is why I love the church." And as long as the Lord gives me breath, I hope to invest my life and energies in the ministry and advancement of the church's mission" (MacArthur, Why I Love the Church, WordPress, 2016).

To that, I say "Amen!" I'm grateful for you, Church Family. I pray daily that we would be a church family that is built on God's unchanging Word who will effectively accomplish our mission of reaching the lost, making disciples, and loving others. I've never been more thankful for what we have together in the Lord. It is truly an exciting time to be a part of Pittsboro Baptist Church.





Kincaid's Hope by Grace Greene

Michael is warmly attentive and Stephen, her exfiancé, follows her to Preston to win her back, but it is the man she doesn't know

Elizabeth Thatcher is young, pretty, cul-



Mara, a woman who has experienced a lifetime of rejection and is now trying to navigate a difficult marriage.


Charissa, a hard-working graduate student who wants to get things right.
