

Lottie Moon: What She Did Still Matters Today

Dear Church Family,

I have a strong question for you to consider: *In 137 years, what will be re-*

membered or said of your life? This question isn't meant to be morbid, but challenging. Let me ask another question: Are you living your life today so that in 137 years, your legacy and impact will not be forgotten? These types of questions can be received in a lot of ways. It's possible that the focus could be completely on you, your status, and your achievements. Or the focus could be on what you were a part of - business, material wealth, and



political activism. Or - and I hope this would be the case with us as believers in Christ – the focus could be on the legacy and impact that you made for the kingdom of God. 137 years is a long time, but most of us live day-to-day without considering how those days turn into weeks, months, years, and decades, and before we know it, we have way more time behind us than we do before us on this parts. this earth. We're not guaranteed tomorrow, but someone's tomorrow will be influenced and impacted by how we live today. What will your life point people to?

Every year for 137 years, Southern Baptists remember the life and impact of internátional missionary Charlotte "Lottie" Moon (1840-1912). Born in Virginia, Lottie Moon grew up in a day when opportunities for women to excel in society were extremely limited. However, she did not allow the societal norms of the day prohibit her from pursuing education, leadership, and growth. Lottie Moon was one of the first ladies in the South to obtain a Master's degree. She mastered Latin, Greek, French, Italian and Chinese; immersed herself in learning the Scripture, and gained a deeper understanding of the mission and purposes of the local church. All of this preparation led her to have a heart for cross-cultural ministry and mission.

In 1873, Lottie Moon was appointed by the Foreign Mission Board to go on a mission trip to China. Her sister was serving there, and she joined her in teaching in a mission school. It was there that she discovered that her God-ordained calling was evangelism and outreach. Twelve years later, she completely moved into full time evangelism, sharing the Gospel with rural villages throughout China. She saw many people come to faith in Christ. She gave her life to the mission field in China, and served there on mission until her death in 1912.

Lottie Moon's ministry came at a high price. She was subject to disease, famine, war, and financial hardship. Regardless of the conditions, she remained faithful to serve the people of China, believing that it was for God's purposes to have her there. While in China, Lottle Moon wrote hundreds of letters to churches and missionary boards in the United States. She would describe the needs for her mission field and sough their support in prayer and financial giving. The example of her life was poured out in her letters as she encompassed the sacrificial love described in 1 John 3:17 that reads: "But if anyone has the world's goods and sees his brother in need, yet closes his heart against him, how does God's love abide in him?" A group of ladies mission boards were so moved by her letters that they raised collectively \$3,315.26 enough to send three new missionaries full time to China! Those efforts led to the creation of the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering for International Missions, which continues today – supporting missionaries around the world as they share the hope of Jesus Christ. Sadly, Lottie Moon passed away in 1912 at the age of 72 while aboard a ship in the harbor at Kobe, Japan. She was on her way home to the United States. Though she has been gone for over 100 years, the reach and legacy of her life still impact missions praying, giving, and going in extraordinary ways. Since its inception 1888, the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering has raised over \$5 billion to international mission support. In 2024, a record \$207.2 million was given. Today, more than 3,500 missionaries all over the world are supported through this offerina.

When I read and hear about Lottie Moon's story, my heart is led to this passage of Scripture: "How then shall they call on Him in whom they have not believed? And how shall they believe in Him of whom they have not heard? And how shall they hear without a preacher? And how shall they preach unless they are sent? As it is written: "How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the gospel of peace, Who bring glad tidings of good things!" (Romans 10:14-15). The Apostle Paul had a desire to see Israel saved, just as Lottie Moon desired to see China saved. The only way that they can be saved is to call upon the name of the Lord, and the only way for them to have opportunity to do that is if someone is sent and proclaims the Gospel. Today, we celebrate the reality that God still sends His church to reach people with the Good News, and WE have the privilege of being a part of this Great Commission effort.

As we reflect on Lottie Moon's story and legacy, the question still remains: **What will be remembered or said of your life 137 years from now?** There are some things that we can be a part of that will extend well past our time on earth. Lottie Moon's impact still matters today. Her story and commitment to Gospel work influences Pittsboro Baptist today, as we celebrate missionaries who have been called to the uttermost parts of the earth like Josh and Cari Jurius (missionaries to Greece in 2026); mission teams that have been sent to Greece in recent years; Suzanne Wiley (a missionary who has recently begun work with the International Mission Board); and Karen Groce (missionary to Mexico). God is using us here at home and abroad for His glory. I am excited for what God will do this Christmas season through your faithful praying, giving, and going. Our gifts, prayers, and availability to missions make an incredible impact for the Kingdom of God.





Thank you, church! This year's Operation Christmas Child was a wonderful success. The Youth and Children's Ministries held a packing party on Wednesday night, November 19th. The fellowship hall was full of fun and laughter as we had dinner together and then packed 75 boxes! PBC supplied the toys, hygiene items, clothing, and school supplies to fill the boxes. The children and youth wrote special notes to their shoebox recipients and prayed for the children who would receive their boxes. It was a meaningful evening for everyone.

Operation Christmas Child 2025 Wrap-Up continued....

Operation Christmas Child National Collection Week was November 17th-24th. Our church was once again a drop-off location, and 16 volunteers collected 1,226 shoeboxes and packed them into 83 cartons before transporting them to their next destination in the Samaritan's Purse logistics chain. Volunteers greeted and prayed with community members dropping shoeboxes, packed and taped cartons, and were the hands and feet of Jesus throughout the week. Thank you, thank you, thank you!





What I Want for Christmas


The Shoe Box by Francine Rivers


