"God's Word Still Speaks"

A few years ago, a company executive received a phone call that seemed completely ordinary and familiar. The voice on the other end of the conversation was unmistakable - it was the voice of his CEO. The voice had the same accent, tone, and style. He requested of the executive to transfer a large sum of money to a partner account through a confidential wire transfer - something that he had done many times before. Trusting the voice, he did. To his horror, he later learned that the voice of his CEO was an AI-



generated imitation designed to deceive him. The words sounded right, but sadly, they weren't real ("Fraudsters Used AI to Mimic CEO's Voice in Unusual Cybercrime Case", WS Journal Article, 2019).

We live in a society filled with false voices, presentations, photographs, news articles, television dramas, and news outlets. From fabricated news stories to AI taking the world by storm, there is an incredibly fine line between what is genuine, true, and authentic and what is counterfeit, fabricated, and deceptive. We have more information at our fingertips and before our eyes than ever before, but uncertainty has also never been at a higher level. Deceivers are everywhere. Who can be trusted? Where can we turn for truth in a world shrouded in falsities and deceit? I'm grateful that as believers in Christ, we have the Word of God. God still speaks clearly, powerfully, perfectly, and sufficiently into our lives.

In a recent and very interesting conversation I had with another young man, the question of how God's Word came into existence, and how it could be trusted, was the focal point. I shared with him the beautiful story of the Bible. I started with 2 Timothy 3:16-17 that states, "All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work." The ancient words of Scripture were not the thoughts and opinions of men, but the voice of the living God, spoken to us for His glory, for our salvation, and for the building up of the life of the one who reads those timeless words (2 Peter 1:21).

I shared how God's Word is authoritative, directive, trustworthy, and protective. The Psalmist declared that "The law of the Lord is perfect, refreshing the soul. The statutes of the Lord are trustworthy, making wise the simple. The precepts of the Lord are right, giving joy to the heart. The commands of the Lord are radiant, giving light to the eyes... the decrees of the Lord are firm, and all of them are righteous." (Psalm 19:7-9). There is no weakness or fault in the Word of God. It is complete, constant, and convicting.

Last, I shared that God's Word is faithful, final, and forever. No document has been more tested, scrutinized, observed, tried, and proven trustworthy than any other document in history (answersingenesis.org, "Bible Section," 2025). Even as the Bible has been challenged, it has proven trustworthy and true. D.A. Carson once said, "What Scripture said, God said. However derived its authority, what the Bible says is stamped with God's authority, for its words are God's words" (Approaching the Bible, 1994). Our Lord gave us a book to tell His redemptive story through the ages. Its content draws us near to His heart, His will, and His eternal plan for humanity. Without it, we are lost, hopeless, and we perish. We can trust God's Word. Across the centuries, God's Word is a steadfast help and anchor for His people. Through fear, God's Word brings confidence (Psalm 34:4). In danger, God's Word brings us to safety (2 Corinthians 1:10). When we experience loss, God's Word comforts (Psalm 23). When we are confused, His Word brings clarity (James 1:5). And when we were without hope, God's Word brought us to Jesus Christ, our Savior (1 Peter 1:23).

I love the Word of God. I am thankful that He still speaks into our lives today. I'm grateful that His truth is what our church is built upon, what our church family faithfully preaches, teaches, and shares, and what drives us to mission. God's Word still speaks. His truth is alive and powerful.



Small Books, Big Impact

As one who did a lot of writing in my career, I can testify it is more challenging to be brief than using lots of words to make a point. The three authors highlighted this month, however, provide potentially life-changing insight in less than 200 pages. Take some time to check-out and read one of these Pittsboro Baptist Church Library's books. Perspectives may be changed. *KTS*

Creation and Fall: Temptation by Dietrich Bonhoeffer

In this enlightening study, renowned twen-



tieth-century theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer offers a careful textual analysis of the story of creation, approaching the biblical tale with the eye of a philosopher and the soul of a true Christian. "Creation and Fall" is Bonhoeffer's lucid, brilliant analysis of the first three chapters of Genesis. Here he discusses the seeming scien-


tific naivete behind the creation story, God's love and goodness, and humanity's creation, its free will, and its blessedness. Bonhoeffer also tackles difficult questions that are raised in the first book of the of the Bible, questions about the seemingly redundant second story of creation, about God's own beginning, about the source of the light that was created on the first day. The author then expounds on Adam and

Eve's fall from How could they, creatures made in God's image, have thought to oppose God so foully? Where did the first evil come from? How did humanity lose its right to live in paradise?

In "Temptation," Bonhoeffer questions how temptation appeared in the midst of Eden's innocence, and he explores the very nature of evil. Bonhoeffer explains that Jesus Christ helps us to understand and conquer physical and spiritual temptation through His grace and goodness. (copied from Apple books.com)


In *The Red Sea Rules*, readers will learn strategies to:
