The Family Altar Sunday: A Day Dedicated to Purpose, Power, and Prayer

Dear Church Family,

The late pastor and writer E.M. Bounds once wrote:

"Blessed is the home which has in it an altar of sacrifice and of prayer, where daily thanksgivings ascend to heaven and where morning and night praying is done."

Over time, many families have lost the wonder of worshiping together. Life is busy, full of distractions, and often weighed down with burdens. In the rush of daily commit-



ments, the quiet moments of prayer and worship at home can easily be forgotten.

Jesus saw this same weariness in His own ministry. Scripture tells us He was moved with compassion for the scattered and burdened (Matthew 9:36). A Recap of the Renewing Worship Expo

This past weekend, a group of thirteen from our church traveled to Statesville, NC, to take part in the Renewing Worship Expo. It was a rich time of worship, learning, and

fellowship, and we are grateful to our church family for the encouragement and support you continually give to our worship and audio/visual teams.

We were especially thankful to have Pastor Peter and several others from the congregation join us. Their presence made the experience even more meaningful as we grew together in faith and purpose.



Friday Night Worship

Some of our team arrived early for the opening night of worship, led by the Liberty University Collective, the Liberty Praise Choir, and Bradley and Holly Knight. The evening was marked by both musical excellence and heartfelt leadership that pointed us to Christ.

One song, All Things, left a lasting impression on our group. Its refrain—"You are working all things for my good. When I cannot see it, God I still believe it"—was a timely reminder that even when we do not see or feel it, God is faithfully at work in our lives. Worshiping together as a church family that evening was especially moving; many of us sang, prayed, and even wept side by side as the Lord worked in our midst.

Saturday Sessions

Saturday brought a full day of teaching and workshops. Dr. Joe Crider, Worship Pastor and seminary professor, challenged us with a powerful keynote on the role of worship in the life of God's people. Some of his main points included:

Throughout the day, our group split up to attend a variety of breakout sessions. Our AV team explored creative and cost-effective ways to improve sound quality. Others attended classes on guitar, vocal training, worship leadership, choir conducting, and even the question of why some people do not sing in worship. Each session offered fresh insight and practical tools for ministry.



Time: 3:00 - 4:30 p.m.




the answers to the immediate mystery at hand and—ultimately—the deeper meaning of his own existence.


