

Be Persistent in Prayer

The four pillars of parish stewardship are hospitality, prayer, formation, and service. Today's readings show us the immense value of prayer and the privileged place it must have in our individual lives and in our parish community.


Our Lord Himself calls us to prayer — and persistence in prayer — in the Gospel passage from Luke. Jesus tells the parable of the nagging widow who finally wears down the judge with her unrelenting persistence in her pursuit of a just ruling from him on her behalf. Jesus goes to great lengths to describe this judge, saying he "neither feared God nor respected any human." Yet even this corrupt judge responds with a just judgment because of the widow's persistence.

Jesus uses this outlandish example to draw a vivid contrast between a reluctant, dishonest judge and our loving, all-merciful Father. If even a bad judge will give a good result in response to a persistent request, how much more (infinitely more) eagerly and perfectly will our good Father respond to our persistent prayers to Him.

If he delays in responding, if he provides a different response from the one we were expecting, we can remain confident and trusting in His goodness, knowing that His response, whenever it comes and in whatever form, will be the very best one for us.

Our job then, as Christian stewards, is simply to remain faithful to our relationship with God through prayer. We must lean on each other in our communities — family and parish — as we support each other in prayer. A strong pillar of prayer will make all our other stewardship efforts fruitful.

Sacraments

<u>Baptism:</u> Parents who wish to have their child baptized must be registered members of St. Joseph Parish and practicing their Catholic Faith. A pre-baptism class must be attended prior to the date of the baptism. Baptisms are celebrated at one of the weekend Masses or at another arranged time. <u>Funerals:</u> Please call the Parish Office in the event of the death of a loved one.

Arrangements will be made for planning of the service including the musicians.

Advanced planning may be done by making an appointment with Father.

Reconciliation: Monday 9:00am-9:30am, during adoration, Saturday 3:00 pm-3:50 pm, Sunday 7:00am-7:50am, or by appointment. Please call the Parish Office.

Weddings: Couples must contact the pastor to make arrangements for marriage. No date should be set until this is done as the church may not be available. The Catholic party must be a registered and practicing member of the parish for at least six months prior to setting a date. In addition, a six month period of preparation is required for marriage.

As I've been saying for a while, this weekend is a rather significant one for our church and school "togetherness," with our Catholic Schools Walk and Trunk or Treat falling on the same day. Our school theme

is "We Are One," which is certainly consistent with all that's going on now. Good times.

All that brought to mind the fact that we're sprucing up our mission statement for the parish. While we continue to peck away at the exact wording and phrasing, we're certainly to stick to the idea that our parish is comprised of four things: prayer/liturgy/sacraments, formation, service, and community. The first one is tricky to pin down, because prayer can be done by anyone and in a variety of ways. Liturgy is anything that is group worship (involving two or more people), and the Sacraments are essentially the seven major ways we express and celebrate our faith as Catholics. For our mission statement, it's been hard to pin one down over the other two.

In any case, formation is anything that involves religious education. That includes everything we do in the school, religious education on Sundays, and anything we offer for an adult to deepen their faith and understanding of God. Service is the collection of good works we do, as a response to our faith. Finally, community sums up all that we do, where we celebrate and rejoice in one another's company: after all, being together is a good thing, even if we're not doing any kind of good works or learning anything new.

So that brings me to the question for you all to ponder for the rest of the day. Of these four things that make up the reality of a Catholic parish, which one is most important to you? I realize that true and healthy faith requires all four things in some capacity, but surely we all gravitate to one over the other three. Are you the kind of person who deeply links your faith to your prayer life or Sunday Mass? Is your greatest thrill as a Catholic the deepening of your knowledge of God, Christ, and the history of the Church? Or perhaps you're one of the many people who's best when you're "praying with your hands," and expressing your love for Christ in what you do for others. Finally, for some folks, it's all about being together and loving one another as Christ commanded us.

I can't tell you what my personal answer is. If I wrote down my answer this instant, I'd probably want to change it later tonight. Nevertheless, I believe it's a worthy thing for all of us to bring to our prayer life. What part of Christian life is most in-line with you, as an individual? Think it over, but never forget that all four things have their time and place in our lives!




