

#### Choose Our Response

Good news, Christian stewards — we are gaining ground on our Advent mountain climb and it is time to take a moment to rejoice in the Good News that our Savior will come again in triumph one day. Today's readings on this Gaudete ("Rejoice") Sunday are filled with reminders of God's final victory over suffering and injustice, and encouragement to remain steadfast in our mission to live as faith-filled disciples.

Such a day almost seems too good to be true, especially when we look around at the dire circumstances we face in our world at present. But by faith, we know this day is coming. Lest we grow weary as we await the glorious day of Christ's return, St. James, in our second reading, offers wise counsel. "Be patient, brothers and sisters, until the coming of the Lord." "Make your hearts firm... Do not complain, brothers and sisters, about one another, that you may not be judged."

This is excellent advice for us Christian stewards as we face the challenges of everyday life in our broken world, especially in the hectic days that precede Christmas when stress can make us and those around us less than our best selves. St. James reminds us that we can choose our response to both the great strains and the minor annoyances of life. In other words, we can be good stewards of our attitude, "making our hearts firm" by practicing patience with others and refusing to give in to the temptation to complain.

We can choose to see and rejoice in God's presence with us, no matter the circumstances surrounding us.

<u>Funerals:</u> Please call the Parish Office in the event of the death of a loved one.


Arrangements will be made for planning of the service including the musicians.

Reconciliation: Monday 9:00am-9:30am, during adoration, Saturday 3:00 pm-3:50 pm, Sunday 7:00am-7:50am, or by appointment. Please call the Parish Office.

Weddings: Couples must contact the pastor to make arrangements for marriage. No date should be set until this is done as the church may not be available. The Catholic party must be a registered and practicing member of the parish for at least six months prior to setting a date. In addition, a six month period of preparation is required for marriage.

#### Severe Weather Procedure



#### These are the guidelines:

- If Elmbrook and/or Wauwatosa public schools close, St. Joseph School will close.
- If St. Joseph School is closed, all daytime activities and all evening activities will be cancelled, including Mass.
- If a weekday snow event falls on a Holy Day of Obligation, there will be Mass, even if school is closed.
- If a snowstorm falls on a Saturday or Sunday, there will be Mass; other events might be cancelled at the director's discretion.

## From the Desk of Father Justin

Ah, the third Sunday of Advent – time to break out the pink socks and focus on the joy of the upcoming celebration of Christmas. Always a good time of the year, to be sure!

I don't have too much to announce on behalf of the parish right now, as we're all-in for Advent programing – our school's Christmas Concert was on the  $10^{th}$ , Breakfast with Jesus was on December  $13^{th}$ , and we have confessions galore at our parish as well as our neighboring parishes. For the record, our Advent Reconciliation Night will be on Wednesday the  $17^{th}$ , starting at 6:00 PM.

With that out of the way, and nothing else particularly demanding of my article space for the moment, I'd like to give a short list of joyful things that have happened in the past three weeks or so.

- We had a lovely holiday party among the staff last weekend, with plenty of conversation and cholesterol. If anyone tells you that they were at the party and that Father Justin doesn't know the difference between the wise men and Saint Joseph, just ignore them and don't ask follow-up questions.
- We have snow drifts near the upper playground (from last weekend's winter storm), and now they're hard packed snow fit for climbing. The students and I have delighted in climbing the tiny hills of packed snow, pretending we're penguins. To play penguins, you dash up the snow, make penguin sounds for a few seconds, and then slide down the hill. Repeat as many times as possible before it's time to go back inside. Fun for all ages\*\*!
- After winning a day of pheasant hunting at last year's school auction, we finally made it happen on December 4<sup>th</sup>: the coldest day of the week, by far. Yet, it was a truly enjoyable day: we bundled up well, and the fresh air and walking did us well. I'm grateful that my first hunting experience was a good one. If you've never been hunting before, this would be a worthwhile thing to bid on this spring... I'm just sayin'!
- There have been many wonderful spiritual conversations throughout these past weeks of Advent. There are so many, they'll get bullet points of their own.
  - We've shared holy memories of Advents-Gone-By at this month's table talk. A simple morning, but a good one!
  - I am very grateful for all the people who stayed after Mass on November 30<sup>th</sup> and December 1<sup>st</sup> for my pastor's talk. Some of Sunday's questions were real zingers, but it was a 45-minute block of time well-spent either for both days.
  - I continue to be deeply proud of how many people come to confession during the weekends: I had an understandably light weekend two weeks ago due to the weather, but the math tends to balance out after a bit more time.
  - 7<sup>th</sup> grade's "ask Father Justin your weird religion questions" was the highlight of that particular Friday.
  - Go-Getters are always good for some nice conversation at Alioto's for their Advent get together. Of course, I never need an excuse to go to Alioto's!
  - Finally, while we have a remarkably small Confirmation class, I can always count on some very fine conversation between 4:00 and 5:30 those Sunday afternoons. It makes for a long weekend, to be sure, but it's worth it to spend a substantial amount of time with at least a few of our young adults.

The above list certainly goes on, but this is a good stopping here. For all the above examples, it is a real joy to discuss and share worthwhile conversation with people: this is what faith sharing is supposed to feel like! It's not meant to be a debate or an argument: it's meant to be a joyful sharing of that which matters most. And I've come to understand that Saint Joseph people are excellent conversationalists.

May the Lord bless you all, and thank you for reading. Between the final Sundays of the year and Christmas, I hope to see you at Mass!
