The Beatitudes

The Gospel Reading for today is what is popularly called the Sermon on the Mount. Many think it is the absolute epitome of Jesus' teachings. To be sure it tells us how we are to live our lives, the attitudes we are to have. We must remember that those who were waiting and hoping for the Messiah expected a military leader, one who would lead them in battle against their oppressors.

In His Sermon on the Mount Jesus gives a more accurate perspective of Who He is. He begins what we call the Beatitudes (the word means "blessings") with "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." In a sense we are all "poor in spirit." Without the guidance and strength provided us by the Lord there is no way we can escape this poverty of spirit, of spirituality, if you will.

That is why we often say that living God-centered lives is at the very core of stewardship. Being a disciple of Christ translates into being a steward of our many gifts and blessings. Some scholars believe that Jesus may have given this sermon often during His ministry. Those who followed Jesus and became the earliest Christians, the first members of the Church, were fond of quoting and referring to what the Lord said on this occasion. As stated, Jesus provides us with the secret of living a good life. If we rely on Him and follow Him, we will be blessed.


Severe Weather Procedure

In the event of severe winter weather, Mass and other activities at St. Joseph Congregation might be cancelled.

- If Elmbrook and/or Wauwatosa public schools close, St. Joseph School will close.
- If St. Joseph School is closed, all daytime activities and evening activities will be cancelled, including Mass.
- If a weekday snow event falls on a Holy Day of Obligation, there will be Mass, even if school is closed.
- If a snowstorm falls on a Saturday or Sunday, there will be Mass; other events might be cancelled at the director's discretion.

Sacraments

Baptism: Parents who wish to have their child baptized must be registered members of St. Joseph Parish and practicing their Catholic Faith. A pre-baptism class must be attended prior to the date of the baptism. Baptisms are celebrated at one of the weekend Masses or at another arranged time. For more information contact the Parish Office.

Funerals: Please call the Parish Office in the event of the death of a loved one. Arrangements will be made for planning of the service including the musicians. Advanced planning may be done by making an appointment with Father.

Reconciliation: Monday 9:00am-9:30am, during adoration, Saturday 3:00 pm-3:50 pm, Sunday 7:00am-7:50am, or by appointment. Please call the Parish Office.

Weddings: Couples must contact the pastor to make arrangements for marriage. No date should be set until this is done as the church may not be available. The Catholic party must be a registered and practicing member of the parish for at least six months prior to setting a date. In addition, a six month period of preparation is required for marriage.

From the Desk of Father Justin

Good morning all, and welcome to the end of January.

The big piece of news this week is the return of financial data in the bulletin. It took some time to establish proper and reliable financial information because you always need a relatively long-term view of things... one month of solid data is simply not sufficient. Now that we've concluded the Parish Offertory Revival Program this month, we can take a look at the past year and make accurate evaluations on the parish's trajectory.

The financials are on the bottom of the following page, with several explanatory sentences beneath to give you some context on those figures. In the future, we'll have these financials in the bulletin once a month, every month. Expect them the 2nd or 3rd weekend of the month, where we can conclusively wrap up the business of the previous month. Future months will probably have a bit less context provided: we went a little heavier on the explanations now because this is our very first one.

I'll let that page speak for itself, with respect to the dollars and cents. However, I'll use my space here for a "from the pastor's perspective" summary and overview. This whole matter has been a major part of my life for almost a year at this point: January of last year was my proverbial starting point. In that year, we spent three months gathering the information necessary for informed decisions. We spent another month or two discussing the facts and how best to proceed. In late spring, we began bringing the general parish up-to-date in the most reasonable way possible. The Parish Offertory Program was started shortly after that.

While I'm not free to go into more details than the above paragraph, this parish has accomplished an astounding amount of progress. On the liturgical side, many of you constantly report to me, with gratitude, that Mass is more lively and powerful than ever. There's a line for confession, almost every Saturday and Sunday, right up until the start time for Mass. We've had literally dozens of people join the parish in the last year. These things and more are indications that our parish is experiencing an authentic revival across the board... in spite of other issues which remain to be solved in their own time.

The financial side of the parish, in my view, is parallel to all of that. We have made tremendous progress in both administrative improvements and financial solvency. We still a ways to go: our money problems are not "solved", in the sense that we can stop focusing on the issue and regress back to our previous levels of parish involvement. Nevertheless, I do sincerely believe that we are well on our way and moving in the right direction. While this year has been a stressful one for many of us, it has also been a year wisely spent. It is my belief that with this year being something of a foundation for future improvement and progress, we can continue to do amazing things and truly live out the mission of any Catholic parish: to go forth to make disciples, and strengthen the faith and devotion of those who are a part of the Body of Christ.






Our family grew in number and faith over 2025!

Fiscal Year to Date (YTD) - For the period July to December 2025, 6 months fiscal year to date, the parish had revenues of \$1,428,355, ahead of budget by \$69,338, primarily a result of the offertory revival program's favorable collections of \$125,000 offset by less tuition revenue of \$45,000 evenly split between Choice and Private. Over the same time frame, actuals expenses were \$1,464,242, which were more than budget by \$75,923, mostly from higher than anticipated maintenance and repairs expense. At the bottom line, operating profit was about what was expected, a \$35,887 deficit.

Annual Budget - The annual parish budget from July 2025 to June 2026 has a structural deficit of \$185,073, meaning we anticipate spending \$185,073 more than we will collect over the year. Most of this shortfall, \$155,771, is expected in the upcoming 6 months. This realistic budget has raised leadership's awareness to increase revenues, resulting in the offertory revival program, and seriously evaluate our entire cost structure, including spending on staffing and vendors.

December - For the month, our actual revenues of \$218,701 were better than expected by \$47,620 as a result of the offertory revival program. Monthly expenses were \$292,138, worse than expected by \$18,836, mostly from maintenance and repairs expense. Overall, operating profit was \$28,784 better than expected.

1 times - there were \$180,847 of 1 time favorable items during the first half of the fiscal year, including five bequests totalling \$143,587 and fundraising of \$37,260 from the Summerfest work. None of these 1 items were in the month of December.
