

## Placing God at the Center

As we begin the season of Lent, the Church invites us into 40 days of renewal and refocusing. Lent is not only about giving something up, but about making room for God. For Christian stewards, this season invites us to reflect on how we are using the time entrusted to us.

In the first reading, Adam and Eve turn their attention away from God and allow doubt to take root. Trust is replaced by self-reliance, and the harmony of the Garden is broken. These same temptations remain familiar when our days become crowded with distractions that pull us away from God.

In the Gospel, Jesus shows us a different path. In the desert, He gives time to prayer and fasting, remains grounded in Scripture, and places His complete trust in the Father. By intentionally giving time to God, Jesus resists temptation and remains faithful.

Lent invites us to do the same. By making space in our schedules for prayer, Scripture, and quiet reflection, we grow in trust and gratitude. When we place God at the center of our time, stewardship becomes a way of life, and our hearts are prepared to celebrate the joy of Easter.

## *From the Desk of Father Justin*

Once more we arrive here at the start of the Lenten season.

If you haven't truly begun yet, fear not - there's still plenty of time between now and Holy Week. A slightly delayed start is hardly anything to lose sleep over.

For your personal reflection this weekend, I invite you to consider how different Lent really is to New Year's Resolutions. You see, New Year's Resolutions are notorious for ending in failure. People make resolutions to eat better or exercise more or perhaps use cleaner language. All those goals are great, of course. However, the newness of the calendar year doesn't particularly help people achieve those goals. We try for a week or two, we get frustrated, and then we quit. Many people quit in a condition that's even worse than when they started! Why is that?

If I had to summarize the problem as briefly as possible, I'd say that it was due to the fact that most New Year's Resolutions are goals without a foundation or clear direction. Whenever I hear about them, it's always in the most generic terms. "I'm going to lose 5 pounds by February". "I'm going to quit smoking." Etc. Lent has more direction. We start with the grounding of our faith. Why do we do something special for Lent? Because we're expressing our love for Christ and our appreciation for our faith. In other words, our true motivation is beyond mere self-improvement (although self-improvement is certainly a vital piece of the puzzle). From there, we're called to work on said faith in one of three basic areas: prayer, fasting, and alms-giving. Are you praying well: do you make time for God? Are you able to fast and say no to the things you've grown accustomed to? Are you giving alms in some way, and showing compassion for others at the expense of your own resources? These questions are very helpful in getting us to focus on what Lent is, how it works, and why we should care in the first place. That alone is a great advantage to keeping that discipline going for 40 days.

Some people do one thing, which is certainly a viable option. Some people do a whole list of things, which is also viable as long as you're not overreaching and biting off more than you can chew. If you happen to be somewhere in the middle, bear in mind that doing two or three things can work rather nicely: strive to do something of the "prayer" category, the "fasting" category, and/or the "almsgiving" category. That can keep your efforts focused and prevent you from overtaxing yourself in one particular way. After all, if you find yourself with diminished will-power regarding food or drink, you probably still retain your strength when it comes to a renewed sense of prayer and devotion.

So those are my "start to Lent tips", and once again: a delayed start is not a deal-breaker! May your journey in the desert begin with ashes but end in glory!

8 oz foam cups, deodorant, white socks, bottled water, hand warmers, ground coffee, sandwich sized Ziploc bags, winter hats and gloves, paper towels, tooth brushes and toothpaste

### Repairers of the Breach



**Who they are:** Milwaukee's only daytime homeless shelter open six days per week.

**Who they serve:** Any adult with a need, usually homeless or at-risk.

**Humble beginnings:** In 1989, six concerned activists pooled \$50 together to create the newspaper "Repairers of the Breach" which was written by, for, and about Milwaukee's homeless men and women. After reaching a circulation of about 6 thousand, they realized they could do more. Repairers of the Breach was chartered in 1991 as a non-profit, and have come a long way since their first location opened at 27th and Wells Street (complete with mismatched chairs and a coffee maker). Since purchase of the building located at 1335 W. Vliet St in 1997, they have since expanded to offer several programs besides the daytime shelter.

**What they provide:** Employment assistance; Shelter & Resources program (including emergency warming room in winter and cooling shelter in summer) that offers showers, hygiene products, and clean clothes, including professional interview clothes to support employment opportunities. There is also the Breach Cafe to nourish, and free medical clinic services via partnerships with the physicians assistant program at Marquette University and the nursing program at UWM. "From free medications for chronic illness like diabetes and high blood pressure, to health monitoring, to vaccine and screening clinics, our medical clinic can do so much with so little because of our valued partnerships in Milwaukee, as well as support from Repairers like you."

**Leadership:** Board of Directors

**Their mission:** To provide life-saving, life-sustaining, and life-restoring programs

"Our vision is simple: an inclusive society whose members all have adequate food, housing, health care, a support system, literacy, and an empowered voice."


