

Open Our Eyes

Today's readings for this Fourth Sunday of Lent are filled with powerful contrasts — God's vision versus human vision, the light of Christ versus the darkness of sin, and spiritual blindness versus spiritual sight. Embracing a stewardship way of life frees us from spiritual blindness, helps us see as God sees, and allows us to reflect Christ's light in our daily lives.

In our Second Reading from Ephesians, St. Paul reminds us, "... You were once in darkness but now you are light in the Lord. Live as children of light." Through Baptism, the very life and light of the Blessed Trinity dwell within us. Yet amid the busyness and challenges of daily life, it is easy to forget this truth. We may even struggle to recognize whether our actions truly reflect Christ's light.

A stewardship way of life — with its intentional and grateful use of our time, talent, and treasure — provides a daily guide to help us live as children of the light. It encourages us to make choices that reflect Christ in the way we serve, give, and love others.

In today's Gospel from John, Jesus restores sight to a man born blind, and the man simply testifies that Christ "opened my eyes." During these Lenten days, we too can ask Jesus to open our eyes — to help us see areas where spiritual blindness may still linger, especially in how we use the gifts entrusted to us.

As we continue our Lenten journey, let us renew our efforts wherever our vision has grown dim, so that by Easter we may truly live as children of the light.



Baptism: Parents who wish to have their child baptized must be registered members of St. Joseph Parish and practicing their Catholic Faith. A pre-baptism class must be attended prior to the date of the baptism. Baptisms are celebrated at one of the weekend Masses or at another arranged time. For more information contact the Parish Office.

Funerals: Please call the Parish Office in the event of the death of a loved one. Arrangements will be made for planning of the service including the musicians. Advanced planning may be done by making an appointment with Father.

Reconciliation: Monday 9:00am-9:30am, during adoration, Saturday 3:00 pm-3:50 pm, Sunday 7:00am-7:50am, or by appointment. Please call the Parish Office.

Weddings: Couples must contact the pastor to make arrangements for marriage. No date should be set until this is done as the church may not be available. The Catholic party must be a registered and practicing member of the parish for at least six months prior to setting a date. In addition, a six month period of preparation is required for marriage.

St. Joseph's Feast Day Pantry Collection



During our St. Joseph's Feast Day Celebration, we will have a collection to a food pantry in the spirit of St. Joseph's table tradition.

What is the tradition of St. Joseph's Table? The tradition of the 'St. Joseph table' of food ('la tavola di San Giuseppe') has its origins in Sicily. Legends from the Middle Ages attributed the end of a devastating drought to prayer-devotion that the Sicilian people made to St. Joseph. This celebration is a symbolic 'thank you' and renewal of the devotion to St. Joseph. It is a *shared* celebration where the riches of food are given as alms to the poor.

St. Joseph's Day Collection for People's Table: People's Table has grown from its roots as **St. Hyacinth Food Pantry** into a lifeline for 20,000 neighbors annually. People's Table is now more than a food pantry; it's a bridge to a better future. By pairing immediate food assistance with programs for long term stability, we empower our neighbors to develop and achieve their goals toward stability. As our neighbors find their footing, they often return to support others, creating a thriving, empowered community.

People's Table currently could use:

- Canned protein (i.e. tuna, salmon, chicken)
- Fresh produce (i.e. potatoes, apples, carrots, oranges)
- Personal care items (i.e. toothpaste, shampoo, deodorant, etc.)

The Continued Story of Our Parish Patron Saint:

- Joseph is believed to have died at home, with both Mary and Jesus present.
- Joseph worked as a carpenter, mason and manual laborer his entire life.
- Remarkably little is known about Saint Joseph, and he is never quoted in any Gospel.
- In 1870, Pope Pius IX declared Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church.
- Thousands of shrines and parishes internationally are dedicated to St. Joseph.
- In the 9th century, he was commonly referred to as "Guardian of the Lord."
- Joseph is the Patron Saint of the dying and of a happy death.
- Originally located near today's Milwaukee County Courthouse, both our Saint Joseph Parish and School were demolished for the freeway and were moved to Wauwatosa in the 1960s. The school was built in 1965, and the church in 1971.




