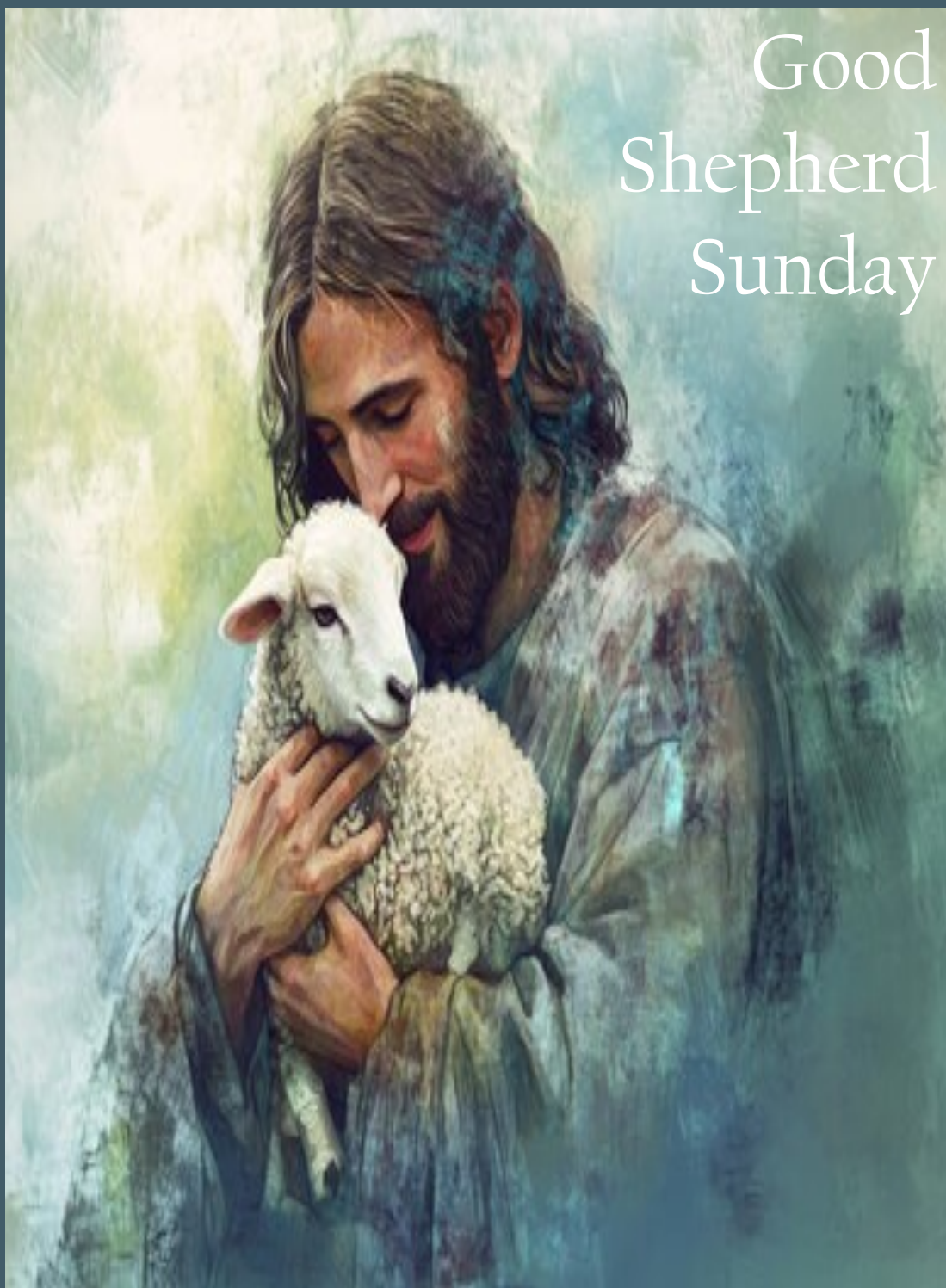

Jesus, our Good Shepherd

Today's readings on this fourth Sunday of Easter offer us a glimpse into the heart of our loving Savior. He is the Good Shepherd and we can confidently place our trust in Him as we live the stewardship way of life.

This endearing image of Jesus as our shepherd, and His personal love for each one of us, is described in our Gospel passage from John, through the words of Jesus Himself. Here we read Jesus' description of Himself as the "Good Shepherd." He says of Himself, "The sheep hear his voice, as the shepherd calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has driven out all his own, he walks ahead of them and the sheep follow him, because they recognize his voice."

This aspect of our Lord's tender and personal love for each one of us is a compelling reason to embrace the stewardship way of life — in the offering of our time, talent, and treasure to Him, we can express our gratitude to Him for the incomprehensible love He has for us.

Embracing this way of life certainly requires trust on our part. But Christ has proven Himself worthy of our trust. He "bore our sins in His body." He calls Himself our shepherd and He offers Himself as the guardian of our souls. He has withheld nothing of Himself and His goodness from us. He would never ask anything of us that would bring us harm. He tells us "I came so that [you] might have life and have it more abundantly."

This Easter season, let us resolve to entrust ourselves and our lives gratefully to Him.

Reconciliation: Monday 9:00am-9:30am, during adoration, Saturday 3:00 pm-3:50 pm, Sunday 7:00am-7:50am, or by appointment. Please call the Parish Office.

Weddings: Couples must contact the pastor to make arrangements for marriage. No date should be set until this is done as the church may not be available. The Catholic party must be a registered and practicing member of the parish for at least six months prior to setting a date. In addition, a six month period of preparation is required for marriage.

From the Desk of Father Justin

Hello and happy Good Shepherd Sunday to you all.

Although our First Holy Communion Mass and Confirmation Mass will both be a week from now, the 4th Sunday of Easter is generally considered the ideal time for those celebrations. The readings for this Sunday always offer an easy connection with Baptism, First Communion, and Confirmation. The Sacraments of Initiation certainly all require a shepherd in our lives to guide us further along the journey of salvation. Parents, godparents, and confirmation sponsors are the first tier for such ministry, with priests, catechists, and teachers serving as second tier support.

I find this an ideal time to share a little reflection from one of the books I was reading recently. I wanted to include it in my homily for this weekend, but my core message was already a bit over my target of eight minutes. All things considered, a bulletin article is a nice place for a secondary message to supplement the accompanying Sunday Mass homily.

As this particular writer was explaining, there are a number of ways we're in relation to Jesus. To perfectly live out life as Christian disciple, you need all three. The first is Jesus as inspiration: he had wise words and went about doing good. We should strive to do good as well, the way he did. That one is relatively easy. The second one is pretty close as well: Christ as brother. Christ loves us and he will always love us no matter what. We are called to remain in that love and love one another in turn.

Then there's the third one. Christ as teacher, Christ as shepherd. This is the hard one for a lot of people. Christ has firm things to say about certain issues, and we are called to take Christ seriously. When we have a question and Christ answers it... that's the answer. To quote Peter Kreeft, if Christ's words aren't enough for you, on what grounds do you consider yourself a Christian? Thus, when we have Christ as our shepherd, we allow him to guide us in life: we know what we should say yes to, and what we should say no to. The Ten Commandments. The Beatitudes. The Bread of Life discourse. The Last Supper. These parts of the Bible provide us with clear instruction for daily life, and they're every bit as important as the parts of the Bible that emphasize God's love for us.

When people accept Christ's brotherhood (and its corresponding love) but not his role as shepherd (and its corresponding instruction & morality), their Christian discipleship remains incomplete. They know what they want: salvation through the love and mercy of Christ. However, they don't fully understand what Christ expects in return: to live one's faith with sincerity and devotion, to turn away from sin, and accept the challenges of love as his representative in the world.

As you continue to enjoy your Good Shepherd Sunday, as the 4th Sunday of Easter, please continue to strive to have your relationship with Christ as complete and whole as it possibly can be.

May God bless you in this endeavor and in all other ways!

Safe Environment Week—April 19th-25th

Each year in the month of April, which is recognized around the country as child abuse prevention month, we dedicate a week to elevating the general awareness of the Church’s efforts to keep our children safe. We want people to know that we are committed to maintaining safe environments in our parishes and schools through adult child abuse prevention training; criminal background checks for all clergy, volunteers working with minors, and employees; safety training for children in each grade level; and adhering to all mandatory reporting requirement laws.



5 FIVE WAYS

to protect your children from sexual abuse

Parents play the primary role in educating their children about sexual abuse. Here are 5 tips for teaching safety to the little ones God has entrusted to you.

1

Keep it practical. Teach your children the differences between safe touches and unsafe touches.

2

Tell your children that saying “no” is okay. Empower your children to say “no” if anyone makes them feel uncomfortable or touches them inappropriately.

3

Give your children a way to alert you. Tell your children they can use an excuse or share a special “code-word” with you to alert you about an unsafe person or situation.

4

Tell your children to report an unsafe touch.

Let your children know they should tell you if they feel uncomfortable or unsafe around any adult or peer. You can also identify other adults they can tell about unsafe touches.

5

Tell your children you trust them. If your child makes a report to you, believe him or her. Tell them it is not their fault and that you love them. Immediately bring the allegation to the attention of public authorities.
