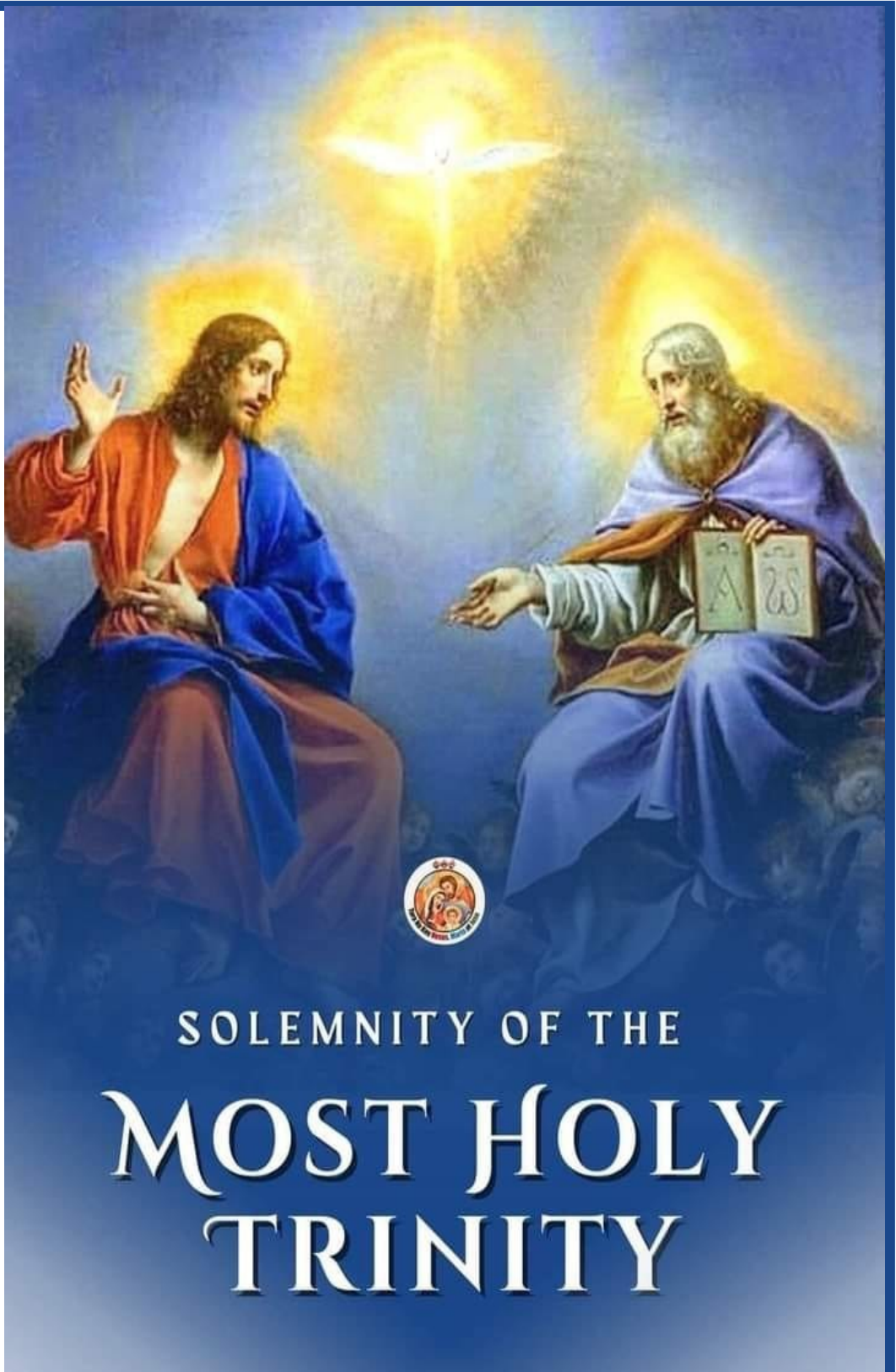

Sacraments

Baptism: Parents who wish to have their child baptized must be registered members of St. Joseph Parish and practicing their Catholic Faith. The Catholic party must be a registered and practicing member of the parish for at least six months prior to setting a date. In addition, a six month period of preparation is required for marriage.

Fiscal Year to Date (YTD) - For the period July to April 2026, 10 months fiscal year to date, the parish had revenues of \$2,283,829, behind budget by \$49,746, primarily a result of the offertory revival program's favorable collections of \$142,080 offset by incorrect timing of the budget May Choice tuition of \$183,825 in April. Over the same time frame, actuals expenses were \$2,312,951, which were more than budget by \$37,796 primarily from higher buildings and grounds expense. Operating deficit was \$29,122, \$87,542 worse than expected.

April - For the month, our actual revenues of \$128,678 were worse than expected by \$195,375 primarily as a result incorrect timing of the budget May Choice tuition of \$183,825 in April. Monthly expenses were \$216,066, worse than expected by \$13,005, mainly from higher than building and grounds expense. Overall, operating deficit was \$87,388, or \$208,380 worse than expected.

1 times - There were \$377,847 of 1 time favorable items during the first ten months of the fiscal year, including three significant captial contributions totalling \$197,000, five bequests totalling \$143,587 and fundraising of \$37,260 from the Summerfest work.

From the Desk of Father Justin

Last Monday was Memorial Day, and a bunch of us represented Saint Joe's at the Elm Grove parade. All-in-all, it went well and it was a very nice morning. However, I got more vocal backlash against my incense blessings than I did last year. At least, I think that's true – I was closer to a marching band last year, so it's possible I got just as many complaints without being in the position to hear them.

As far as the people's reactions go, here's the basic breakdown:

Most people appreciated the incense blessing, with some signing themselves or showing some form of appreciation.

Some adults and most children asked what I was doing, and as best as I could, I gave quick but accurate answer: "it's holy smoke from Jerusalem, God bless you!"

A few people scoffed at the blessing. One older man at the beginning of the parade said "OK, that's a bit much". Another person apologized to his friend because he thought that the blessing was only valid for baptized Catholics.

A select few were truly angry with me. The top prize goes to an older woman who came up to me in the road, because I was a little bit ahead of the rest of the Saint Joseph group. "Father, I have a question for you. Why do you priests asphyxiate the entire church with that stuff these days? It is because of our current pope?" With sincerity in my voice and a smile on my face, I truthfully answered "It represents our prayers, rising up to God." Upon my answer, her face became even more sour and said "Oh screw you!" right to my face and huffed her way back to her lawn chair. I doubt any other answer would have gotten a different response.

For this article today, it is my sincere wish to turn this into a learning opportunity... if only for our parishioners who read our bulletin. Clearly, this will be a fraction of the parade's attention.

The bottom line is very simple: we can bless literally anyone or anything that is not inherently sinful. As Catholics, we have car blessings, animal blessings, wedding anniversary blessings, rosary blessings, house blessings, sports blessings, and more. Incense in a thurible is an ancient form of blessing, where the rising smoke is a physical sign of our prayers rising up to God. Incense can be used to bless just about anything, and incense can absolutely be used outside of a church. In fact, when the Catholic seminarians played flag football against the Anglican seminarians of Nashotah House, the Anglicans used incense to bless the football before the game. Literally everyone loved it and saw it for the sincere expression of faith that it was.

With that in mind, my only desire on Monday was to bless as many people as possible during the parade. It was a once-a-year opportunity to express my faith and offer blessings outside of the church grounds of Saint Joe's. It wasn't a mockery of religion in any way. What's more, I went into that situation fully aware that not everyone would appreciate or understand what I was doing. So why risk it? Why go through the trouble instead of just passing out candy like everyone else? Let me give you two bits of wisdom. I'll mix it up and go for a Bible reference and a non-Bible reference.

"Blessed are you when they insult you and persecute you and utter every kind of evil against you falsely because of me." -Matthew 5:11

Those two quotes nicely remind me that no matter how perfect or well-intentioned we might be, people are going to complain and see things in the worst possible context. Therefore, to be as authentic as possible in life means that at least some insults and evil utterances will be unavoidable along the way.

With that basic idea in mind, let's directly address the question. Why bother doing something that will earn complaints, when doing nothing would be easier? In short, it isn't my job to do nothing or take the easy way out. I am a man of the Church, and for all my flaws and failures, there is nothing I want more in life than to bring souls closer to Christ. I'm not going to do that passing out candy. Priests don't bring people closer to Christ by doing exactly what society demands. No, we're much more likely to properly serve Christ by joyfully expressing our faith in a way that is new, unusual, unexpected, and attention-grabbing. That strikes me as spiritual soil that is far more fertile for the Holy Spirit to work with. Will such efforts turn one gold coin into ten? Probably not. How about five? Maybe, on a good day. What if that one coin merely breaks even? That would be a shame, but at least I tried to use it well. However, Sacred Scripture plainly states that it is foolishness to take that one coin and bury it, out of fear for losing it. Christ never asks us to play it safe in life, but to be bold and confident with the knowledge that the Holy Spirit is with us as the Body of Christ.

I hope you all had a restful and Spirit-filled Pentecost Sunday and Memorial Day. May the Holy Spirit bless you, now and forever, in ways that you cannot yet begin to comprehend!

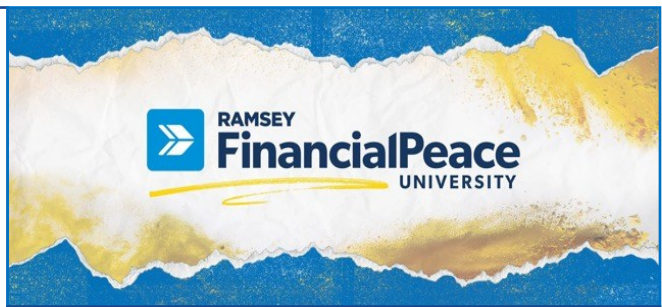
