Confession offered as well.

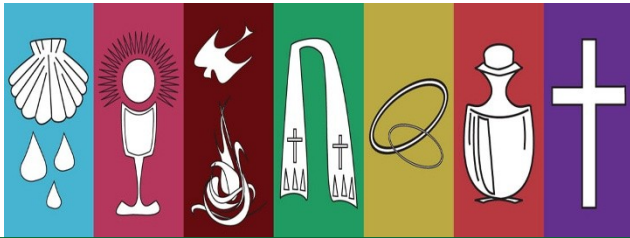
Holy Hour/Adoration will take place the first Thursday of the month.

## Sacraments

**Baptism:** Parents who wish to have their child baptized must be registered members of St. Joseph Parish and practicing their Catholic Faith. A pre-baptism class must be attended prior to the date of the baptism. Baptisms are celebrated at one of the weekend Masses or at another arranged time.

**Funerals:** Please call the Parish Office in the event of the death of a loved one. Arrangements will be made for planning of the service including the musicians. Advanced planning may be done by making an appointment with Father.

**Reconciliation:** Monday 9:00am-9:30am, during adoration, Saturday 3:00 pm-3:50 pm, Sunday 7:00am-7:50am, some Sundays 9:45am-10:20am or by appointment. Please call the Parish Office.

**Weddings:** Couples must contact the pastor to make arrangements for marriage. No date should be set until this is done as the church may not be available. The Catholic party must be a registered and practicing member of the parish for at least six months prior to setting a date. In addition, a six month period of preparation is required for marriage.

## Coaching Tips from Christ

In today's Gospel passage, from Luke, we find our Lord appointing disciples to go out and prepare others to receive His invitation into the Kingdom of God. Every verse has something to say about the way a Christian steward should approach others. Let's consider at least one of the coaching tips Christ gives.

"The Lord appointed seventy-two others whom He sent out ahead of Him in pairs to every town and place He intended to visit." In His wisdom, Christ sent His disciples out not as individuals but in pairs, as teams. This approach to evangelization certainly provided practical advantages. The disciples could lean on each other for mutual support and encouragement, helping each other to stay on task and to put their heads together to pray and problem-solve. This teamwork approach is just as relevant to us modern-day Christian stewards. It takes courage and commitment to go out and invite others into the Christian life. We need to work together to do it well.

But there is also symbolic importance to working in teams. It points to the reality that when we invite others to embrace the Good News of the Gospel, we are not merely inviting them into a belief system, but into a relationship with Christ and through that relationship, into Christ's family — our fellow Christian disciples near and far.

Our parish is our immediate spiritual family in this extended worldwide fold. We are not meant to live as isolated individuals within the parish any more than we are meant to live in isolation within our families. We are meant to be a community. That is why it is so important for us to foster a vibrant, supportive, welcoming parish life. This is why we emphasize hospitality as one of the pillars of stewardship. It is not enough just to point others to Christ; we must invite them to join us in community with Him; we must offer a place and mission for them in the Church and within our parish family.

As for the holiday itself, I've always believed that it's best to spend at least a part of the day actively doing something that acknowledges the uniqueness of the day. For instance, part of Christmas should indeed be spent in church and rejoicing in the birth of Christ. New Year's Eve is a good occasion to reflect upon the previous year and what the next year might offer. This principle applies just as easily to birthdays, anniversaries, significant days for your family history, etc. When we get a holiday or some other day off from work, we should certainly spend some of that time resting and relaxing in our own individual fashions. Dear Congregation of St. Joseph Catholic Church,

Thank you very much for your warm welcome! Theresa and I appreciate all the kind words and encouragement you have given us. St. Joseph is a beautiful church, and we are grateful to be here with all of you.

My mother and father, Merle and Patricia Lotz, met at Drake University in Des Moines, Iowa, where they were both music and piano majors. Mom was from a small town in Iowa, and Dad was from Pennsylvania. When they graduated, they accepted teaching positions in Portland, Oregon, where I grew up. Dad was a church music director, and a pianist with the Oregon Symphony. He was also my high school choir director for four years, and I learned a lot from watching him work with different musical groups, in church and at school. Mom was a piano teacher and children's choir director, and worked as a professional accompanist in the Portland area. She was also my first piano teacher, when I was seven years old. For my piano lesson, she had me go out the back door and walk around the house, and then knock on the front door and go in for my lesson. Mom wanted me to take it seriously, and I probably did after that exit and entrance! After one year, my parents took me to other piano and music teachers in the Portland area, and they were very generous in providing lots of opportunities for me to musically grow and learn new things.

After college in Texas, and doing some touring and working as a church music director and freelance musician in the Northwest, I moved to Los Angeles, where I became the music director of St. John the Baptist Catholic Church, a 10,000 family multicultural parish in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles. I met my wife, Theresa, at that church. She also comes from a musical family, with both her mother and grandmother having been cantors, musicians, and music leaders in the Catholic Church. Theresa has extensive experience as a musician and singer, and comes from a strong family background, where their Catholic faith is an integral part of their lives.

Theresa and I eventually moved to Sedona, Arizona, where we were the music and liturgy directors at St. John Vianney Catholic Church. We moved from Sedona to Milwaukee to be with you, and we are now excited to be part of this great faith community!

As you may have noticed, I really like it when the congregation is singing. The involvement of the congregation in the music of the Mass is an important focus of the music ministry. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops issued a document called, "Sing to the Lord: Music in Divine Worship." In their document, the bishops included this instruction for the parish music director: "The full and active participation by all the people is the aim to be considered before all else, for it is the primary and indispensable source from which the faithful are to derive the true Christian spirit."

When I first read those words by the bishops, it struck a chord in me. My experience had taught me the same thing, that when I was providing music that encouraged the congregation to sing, I was being the most helpful. When the congregation is involved and singing, you can feel the Holy Spirit moving! I try to choose songs and hymns that are singable, with good melodies and lyrics, including older more traditional hymns, and newer contemporary songs. I believe St. Joseph is a really good singing congregation! It is great to share music with you, and hear our voices blending together in the church. One of my favorite things is when I feel like I hardly have to play piano at all, because the congregation is singing so well. So if you want to make your new music director happy, please sing with gusto! And if anyone in the congregation wants to sing along with any of the harmony parts you hear us doing, please feel free to do that too!

Thanks again for all your kind words and encouragement. Theresa and I look forward to singing and praying with you in this beautiful church!

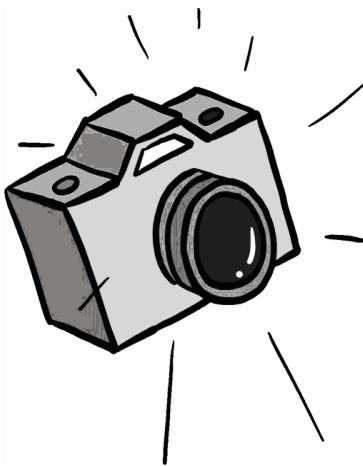
