

The Cross is Vital to Our Salvation

One of the aspects of our stewardship should be a desire to understand and appreciate the significance of many of the celebrations, feasts, and solemnities we as Catholics observe and experience. Today's Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross celebrates three historical events: the finding of the True Cross by St. Helena; the construction and dedication of churches by Helena's son the Emperor Constantine on the site of Mt. Calvary where Christ was crucified; and the return of the Cross to Jerusalem by the Emperor Heraclius II.

As Catholics, we need to remember the Cross every time we make the Sign of the Cross. We make that sign often and almost always at the beginning and the end of our prayers. However, that sign in itself is a prayer. Sometimes we do it automatically without really considering its meaning and importance. Rather than a hurried sign, we should make the Sign of the Cross with reverence, respect, and the constant reflection of how vital the Cross is to our salvation. Stewardship invites us to practice our faith with this deference and appreciation to the Lord, truly in the Name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.



Sacraments

<u>Baptism</u>: Parents who wish to have their child baptized must be registered members of St. Joseph Parish and practicing their Catholic Faith. A pre-baptism class must be attended prior to the date of the baptism. Baptisms are celebrated at one of the weekend Masses or at another arranged time.

<u>Funerals</u>: Please call the Parish Office in the event of the death of a loved one. Arrangements will be made for planning of the service including the musicians. Advanced planning may be done by making an appointment with Father.

<u>Reconciliation</u>: Monday 9:00am-9:30am, during adoration, Saturday 3:00 pm-3:50 pm, Sunday 7:00am-7:50am, or by appointment. Please call the Parish Office.

Weddings: Couples must contact the pastor to make arrangements for marriage. No date should be set until this is done as the church may not be available. The Catholic party must be a registered and practicing member of the parish for at least six months prior to setting a date. In addition, a six month period of preparation is required for marriage.

truly been nights to remember. Last year's Saint Joseph's beer garden was very different. The joy and community were both far more palpable, and people of all ages were having fun well into the night.


Now that we're coming up on the next one, I find myself sincerely eager to wrap up the Saturday 4:00 Mass and head over to the gym entrance for some good times. I hope to see many of you there - it is indeed worthy of a bit of your attention... even if you only have the time to swing by for an hour or so.

On this note, I'd like to remind you all about why we do these sorts of things: no, it's not about the money. It's about coming together as a community. It's about assembling and enjoying time together as friends and neighbors. We all need that sort of thing in life, and a parish is in a uniquely strong position to offer exactly that.

The Saint Joseph Stewardship Community is currently reworking our mission statement. I'm not sure when we'll have the final product ready to go, but we believe that the mission statement should reflect our key values as a parish. As such, the first draft had three things: liturgy, formation, and service. That was a good start, but I insisted on adding a fourth thing: community. Community is something we do very well, and it deserves to have a place in the mission statement. Our beer garden (along with our chili cook-off, trivia night, bingo, etc.) is an example of that value of community. It's not liturgy, formation, or service. And yet, it has its part to play in the life of Christian discipleship: church life needs to be more than going to Mass followed by religious ed, with occasional visits to the local soup kitchen. As disciples, we should indeed pray, study our faith, and serve the poor and needy. No question about that! But we also need to celebrate and be thankful for God's gifts: for starters, we can all be thankful for the gift of life and good people we can share that life with.

I hope to see you at Mass, at Saturday's beer garden, and/or our first session of religious education on Sunday. There's lots for us to do, and may it serve to enrich our faith, hope, and love!




