



## *From the Desk of Father Justin*

As I write this up on Monday, March 2nd, I'm greatly looking forward to our parish auction on Saturday, March 7th. I realize that the vast majority of you are reading this after the auction is over, so hopefully my comments here aren't too obsolete.

After a six-year assignment at a church without a school, these sorts of auction nights are some of the things I really missed. Especially during my two years at Cabrini, things like the school auction were always a joy because it gave us all a chance to be together outside of the classroom or church. I got to socially interact with teachers and parents and celebrate the kids and the school in general for a while.

Now, here at Saint Joe's, I think of all the people I see in the back pews or on the balcony at Mass - people I kind of know, but literally at a distance. Some parents and I have 90% of all of our interactions in the parking lot during morning drop-off. The worst combo for everyone is, of course, when we only see each other at meetings. That's hardly an ideal foundation for any kind of relationship!

So as the year's parish auction unfolds, may we be mindful of what it's all about. Yes, there is a fund-raising component to it all: we need to be financially responsible for the parish and school, and an auction is a fun way to help make that happen. I do hope everyone is able to give generously. But beyond that, remember that we are not purely an educational institution, we're a community of faith - emphasis on the word "community". Being together and being there for one another is a huge part of being Catholic (frankly, being religious in general) and belonging to a parish and/or private school. I hope and pray that the spirit of community and togetherness remains a strong and vibrant factor when Saturday evening rolls around. And of course, I hope to see you there!

Before I wrap this up for the week, I have one amusing lesson I learned the hard way. At our first school auction at Cabrini, we went to the Washington County Fair Grounds, which didn't have enough of a WiFi presence for a phone-based bidding system for the silent auction. As such, it was a good old-fashioned system of pen and paper. You wrote down your name and auction number and your bid. Others would then write their names down after yours with a higher bid. Pretty basic stuff.

Well, I wanted to participate, so I dabbled in this and that and I bid on a variety of things that seemed somewhat interesting. When the night was over, the volunteers printed off my bill and handed it to me at the table. Apparently, I owed them just over \$1000, almost all of it being the silent auction. Once I picked my jaw up from the floor, I realized what happened. I literally won every single item I bid on. What is the lesson at work here, dear reader?

### St. Rose Food Pantry



**Who they are:** St. Rose of Lima Catholic Church, located in Milwaukee at 540 N 31st Street, is part of the St. Michael and St. Rose Catholic Parish Community.

**History:** Saint Rose of Lima Parish was founded by Irish immigrants coming from Canada and from the Eastern States in 1888. Throughout its history, Saint Rose of Lima has been the spiritual home of Irish, African Americans, Puerto Ricans, Mexicans, and since fall of 2021, a faith home for French speaking Catholics from African and other latitudes. St. Rose of Lima offers multilingual masses, including English, Spanish, Hmong, Karen and Karenni.

**Who they serve:** 1 in 11 families in Wisconsin experiences food insecurity. This rate is much higher in Milwaukee and the neighborhood around the Parish. They are open to all people regardless of whether they attend the parish or not. "Christ calls us to serve through the works of mercy and this is one of the ways members of our community try to imitate Christ."

**What they provide:** They offer food items, some clothing, and basic household toiletries. The food pantry is open on the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays of the month at 4:00 PM.

**Parish Community is currently led by:** Rev. Michael Wolfe, Pastor; Shared Associate Pastor Rev. Lawrence Chakrit Micaphitak CSsR; Assisting Priest Fr. Glenn Powers; Parish Deacon Eugenio Ramirez-Murphy

**Their mission:** "We hope to help families and individuals who are struggling to provide for their families."

# ST. JOSEPH'S FEAST DAY PANTRY COLLECTION



During our St. Joseph's Feast Day Celebration, we will have collections to benefit two food pantries in the spirit St. Joseph's table tradition.

**WHAT IS THE TRADITION OF ST. JOSEPH'S TABLE?** The tradition of the "St. Joseph Table" of food ("la tavola di San Giuseppe") has its origins in Sicily. Legends from the Middle Ages attributed the end of a devastating drought to a prayer-devotion that the Sicilian people made to St. Joseph. This celebration is a symbolic "thank you" and renewal of the devotion to St. Joseph. It is a *shared* celebration where the riches of food are given as alms to the poor. In the spirit of St. Joseph's table we will be holding the following food drives.

**PANTRY SUNDAY COLLECTION FOR ST ROSE:** St. Rose Pantry is in St. Rose of Lima Parish on 30<sup>th</sup> and Michigan Ave in Milwaukee. This neighborhood is known to have high levels of food insecurity. St. Rose provides food, clothing and toiletries to over 2900 people annually.

People's Table currently could use:

- Canned protein (i.e. tuna, Beef-a-Roni)
- Canned fruit and vegetables
- Cereal, spaghetti noodles, Mac-n-Cheese


