#### Our God-Given Responsibility

Our readings today show us that living a stewardship way of life, that is, a life focused on serving God and His Kingdom, is not easy. They also show us that our lives belong to God, not to us, and that God will indeed bring about the fulfillment of His kingdom. We just need to have faith that He can do it and commit to our small part in His grand design. This is both our privilege and responsibility as Christian stewards.

Jesus makes this privilege and responsibility clear in today's Gospel passage from Luke. When the apostles ask the Lord to increase their faith, He tells them that even a mustard seed-sized faith is all that is needed to move mountains (because it is God who does the heavy lifting). We need only take the tiniest step forward, and He will do the rest.

But living our lives in His service is also very much our responsibility, as Jesus explains through the parable of the unprofitable servant later in this passage. Our Lord describes a scene in which a servant has just come in from tending to the master's affairs and asks whether it would be reasonable for the master to begin waiting on his servant. Of course, it would not be reasonable! The servant would be expected to continue to serve his master until he has completed the work the master has given him that day. Jesus says we should have this same attitude before God.

The time, talents, and treasure entrusted to us are all God's. Our very lives belong to Him. Whatever we do on God's behalf with our lives and our gifts is simply our God-given responsibility.

The stewardship way of life makes the privilege and responsibility of serving Christ and His kingdom a reality.

The Catholic party must be a registered and practicing member of the parish for at least six months prior to setting a date. In addition, a six month period of preparation is required for marriage.

# From the Desk of Father Justin

For week 2 of Respect Life Month, I'd like to share a fond memory with you all. Please allow me to take you all back to the heady year of 2005. This was a... less than stellar year for me. I graduated college in 2004, so late 2004 and all of 2005 was my "what the heck am I going to do

with my life now that I'm out of college?" phase. That phase ended when I shipped out for the Peace Corps in 2006, making 2005 one of the most awkward and uncertain years of my life. I moved to Madison for a bit, and started working while discerning what was to come next in my life. Along with the fact that my life felt a bit directionless I was deeply lonely. My high school friends were all far away (some still serving in the military), my college friends were around but largely in the same mental state as me, and I completely failed to make new friends as a guy fresh out of college and trying to jumpstart his adult life. In more ways than one, it felt like my life was on pause. I felt like a worthless loser with an equally useless college degree, and it seemed that I was years away from being a productive member of society, to say nothing of being a happy and fulfilled individual.

At this point of the story, some of you know how that feels - when your life is at a true "low point". For those of you who haven't been there yet, a low point in life is fertile ground for God to easily move you. At least for me, I was starved for meaning and significance. In 2005, in a way that doesn't apply to other years of my life, I was absolutely aching for a Mission. A Quest. I wanted something to give myself to, body and soul; in 2005, I was only living for myself, and I could feel in my very bones that such a lifestyle would never satisfy me. Even if I wouldn't have phrased it this way back then, my ears were wide open for God. In the movies, people in this state dramatically raise their arms up in a thunderstorm and cry out to the sky "Lord, give me a sign!"

The full answer to my plea was the Peace Corps, as stated above. It was exactly what I needed, and I will forever be grateful for my two years in Africa. However, God gave me a couple of "little signs" before the big one of "Justin, get out of America and suffer in the sweltering African heat, out of love and respect for your fellow human beings".

Here's where we get to the Respect Life connection. The runner-up winner of "God moments of 2005" was in the library of Saint Paul's Catholic Church, right on the UW Madison campus. I was early for a young adult gathering, so headed up to the library, helped myself to a comfy chair, and flipped through a few books to pass the time. I literally thank God that my fingers pulled a certain book off the shelf. "The Unaborted Socrates" by Peter Kreeft. Frankly, I consider it his masterpiece, and I've come to love many other works of his.

To anyone else, it was a quiet moment in a library. To me, that early evening was an absolute explosion of spiritual energy. My soul was on fire and my mind was reeling with excitement as I read a Socratic-method argument for the pro-life stance. I literally couldn't read the words fast enough. I had never read anything like that before. To this day, I believe that was a pivotal moment in my life where I became addicted to The Truth. Religious truth, secular truth, poetical truth: you name it, I want it. Truth is never boring. Truth is never outdated. Truth is never unworthy of our attention.

Now, two decades later, I look back on that fond moment in the library. Would I have read that book so eagerly, if I was content and satisfied with the state of my life? I doubt it. I believe that everything came together perfectly in that way. A phase of my life ended, and as I impatiently waited for another phrase to begin, Christ brought me face-to-face with something vitally important to me as a human being. In that moment, He blasted me with that vital truth like water from a firehose, and life has never quite been the same since. And I remain forever grateful for that moment (and all the other little moments) where the Lord brings us closer and closer to Him, in ways that don't seem to happen on more common days.

May God bless us this October. And may our collective awareness always lead us to the basic truth: *All Life Is To Be Respected.*




