

OCTOBER 12, 2025 – 28TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Jesus asked, 'Were not all ten cleansed? Where are the other nine? Was no one found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?' Then he said to him, 'Rise and go; your faith has made you well.'" (Luke 17: 17-19)

Gratitude to God has the power to break our chains of sadness, bitterness, and disenchantment. It empowers us to step out of the prison of self-pity and into the reality of God's abundant love. It shifts our focus from what we lack to what we have received, from what wounds us to what heals us.



Where do we learn this? The Mass. The priest says "it is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks" Always and everywhere. Not just when life is easy. Not just when prayers are answered as we expect. Gratitude is not a passive feeling. It is an act of faith. In the eucharist, we remember that Christ himself has given everything for us. And in this act of gratitude, we are healed .— Fr. John Muir




