DECEMBER 14, 2025 - 3RD SUNDAY OF ADVENT



Jesus spoke to the crowd about John "He is the one about whom it is written "I will send my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way before you. Truly, I tell you, among those born of women, there has not risen anyone greater than John the Baptist; yet whoever is least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he." (Matthew 11:10-11).

The apparent paradox—that the least person in the Kingdom is greater than John—marks a significant shift in how God interacts with humanity. The "least" in the Kingdom of Heaven, however, lives in the new covenant inaugurated by Christ's life, death, and resurrection. This new era offers full intimacy with God and is founded on grace and forgiveness. John was great by human and prophetic standards, but greatness in Heaven is a status *conferred by grace*, not earned by human merit. Even the most humble follower of Jesus possesses a spiritual standing and intimacy with God that surpasses even the greatest Old Testament saint.

The Privilege of the Present Believer: The words are a call to appreciate the immense spiritual privilege granted to contemporary Christians. This should inspire profound gratitude and a sense of responsibility to live in accordance with the greater light and greater access to God we have been given.




FEAST OF CHILD JESUS (SANTO NIÑO), JAN. 10TH

This is the time of year when most people give and receive. We thank you for your generosity and good stewardship to St. Matthew Parish as we continue the mission of Jesus Christ. As you search for

the perfect gift for a loved one, remember that a year-end charitable gift in their name is deeply appreciated. Visit our website at www.stmatthewseattle.org and click on the "giving/donate" button.

QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTIONS

A qualified charitable distribution (QCD) is a direct transfer of funds from your IRA custodian, payable to a qualified charity. A QCD excludes the amount donated from taxable income, which is unlike regular withdrawals from an IRA. QCDs don't require that you itemize, which due to recent tax law changes, means you may decide to take advantage of the higher standard deduction but still use a QCD for charitable giving.

DONOR ADVISED FUNDS

A donor advised fund is like a charitable investment account for the sole purpose of supporting charitable organizations. When you contribute cash, securities or other assets to a donor advised fund, you are generally eligible to take an immediate tax deduction. Funds are disbursed at your discretion.

WAYS TO GIVE BEYOND CASH

IRA

When you utilize an IRA for charitable giving, you can satisfy your required minimum distribution (RMD) obligations if you are 73 or older, while also supporting a cause you care about. The donated amount is excluded from your taxable income, which can provide a tax advantage, especially if you do not itemize deductions.

Gifts of securities (stocks, bonds, mutual funds) are some of the best gifts to make whether they have appreciated or not. Contact your broker to inform them of your request, and give them the Archdiocesan stock donation form available at the parish office, or from our website at www.stmatthewseattle.org and click on "Support Us, Online Giving".
