Jesus does not ignore suffering, rather, He promises comfort, justice, and joy to those who remain faithful amid hardship.

They challenge us to measure success not by achievement but by faithfulness, not by recognition, but by love. Thank you and well done, good and faithful servant. God loves you







FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for Baptism or of renewal of Baptism at Easter. (Code of Canon Law, 1249-1252)

Ash Wednesday, February 18th and Good Friday, April 3rd, are days of fast and abstinence.

Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence.


- Catholics age 4+ practice abstinence, which means no meat allowed on days of abstinence.
- Catholics age 18-59 practice fasting. On a fast day, one full meal and two small meals that do not equal one full meal

When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence,
Fr. Ross should be consulted.
