JANUARY 4, 2026— THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

In Matthew's gospel 2:1-12, we hear the familiar story of the Magi who journeyed from the East, guided by a star, in search of the newborn King. Though they were foreigners, they recognized God's invitation and acted with faith and courage. The Magi teach us that God reveals Himself to those who sincerely seek



Him. Their long and uncertain journey reminds us that faith is not passive—it calls for action, trust, and perseverance. They did not turn back when the road became difficult; instead, they pressed forward, confident that God was leading them. When they finally encountered the Christ Child, the Magi responded with humility and worship offering their gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh—symbols of Christ's kingship, divinity, and sacrifice. Their generosity challenges us to ask what gifts we offer to the Lord: our time, our talents, and our hearts.

As a parish community, may we remain attentive to the "stars" God places in our lives—signs that draw us closer to Christ. Like the Magi, may we seek Him faithfully, worship Him humbly, and offer Him our very best.



C, M, B (name of 3 Magi-Caspar, Melchior, & Balthasar) -Christus Mansionem Benedicat (Latin for "May Christ Bless this House"; year 2026.

As you are writing pray one of the following prayers:

- Lord God of heaven & earth, you revealed your onlybegotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.
- Lord our God, bless this household. May we be blessed with health, goodness of heart, gentleness, and the keeping of your law. We give thanks to you, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, now and forever. Amen






VOLUNTEER MONEY COUNTERS NEEDED
