JANUARY 25, 2026 –3RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Matthew 4:12-23 marks the formal beginning of Jesus' public ministry. In the face of John the Baptist's arrest, Jesus does not withdraw in defeat but brings light to Galilee, fulfilling Isaiah's prophecy that those who dwell in the darkness will see a great light. His message is clear and urgent: **"Repent, for the Kingdom of Heaven is at hand."** Repentance calls for a genuine change of heart and a new direction in life.



Jesus then calls ordinary fishermen to follow Him, and they respond immediately, leaving behind their nets and livelihood. Their response shows that discipleship requires trust, availability, and the willingness to let go.

Jesus' mission of teaching, proclaiming the Kingdom, and healing reveals that God's reign is made present through both word and compassionate action. This Gospel invites us to respond to Christ's call and to follow Him with faith and commitment.

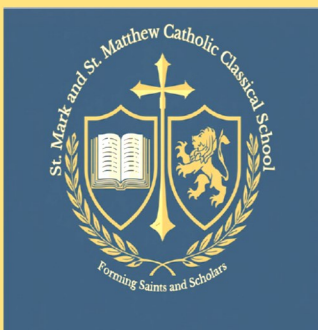

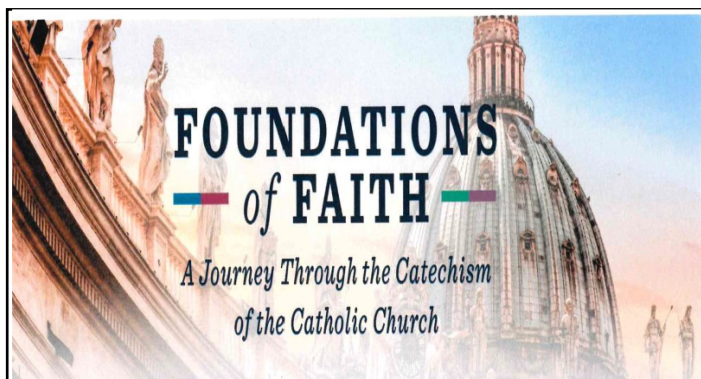

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL QUARTERLY REPORT- OCTOBER –DECEMBER 2025



Our financial focus this last quarter continued to be primarily providing rent and utility help. Your generosity helps so much to also provide food and essential cleaning and personal supplies which stretch our neighbors’ tight budgets. We again did not have the manpower to do Thanksgiving baskets, but, with your generosity, were able to brighten Christmas with food (including a chicken), and Safeway cards for 57 households. We also had a large donation of gently used children’s books to give an unexpected treat for the holidays to 38 families.

During the quarter we:

- Paid \$19,748 in rent and utilities
- Delivered 187 bags/boxes of food to 124 households, including 57 families for Christmas.
- Delivered 38 bags of household, hygiene and baby items.
- Provided \$610 of \$10 Safeway cards (and a few remaining Fred Meyer), primarily with the holiday deliveries, to allow for purchase of perishable food items and sundry needs.
- Had \$606 in vouchers redeemed at the St. Vincent de Paul store, primarily for clothing.

Overall, we served 168 households, helping 405 people.

Thank you for your generous support of the St. Matthew Conference of the St. Vincent de Paul Society. We could not have done this work without your help.

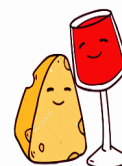
