DIOCESE OF SAN BERNARDINO OFFICE OF THE BISHOP

Mis queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo:

Les deseo paz y bienestar en estos cálidos días de verano. Les escribo de nuevo sobre el doloroso y difícil tema de la inmigración. Hemos visto un cambio y un aumento en los operativos en contra de inmigrantes en nuestra región y específicamente en nuestra diócesis. Las autoridades apresan ahora a hermanos y hermanas de forma indiscriminada, sin respetar su derecho al debido proceso ni su dignidad como hijos de Dios. A nuestras comunidades inmigrantes que sufren el trauma y la injusticia de estas tácticas les reitero que su Iglesia está con ustedes y los apoya. Junto con ustedes, llevamos a costas el peso de esta terrible cruz.

Si bien respetamos y valoramos el derecho que tienen las fuerzas del orden de proteger a nuestras comunidades de los delincuentes violentos, ahora vemos que los agentes detienen a personas al salir de su hogar, en su lugar de trabajo y en otros lugares públicos escogidos al azar. Hemos tenido al menos un caso en que los agentes de inmigración ingresaron a un predio parroquial y detuvieron a varios. No debe sorprendernos que esta situación genere un gran temor, confusión y angustia en muchos. Esto no es lo que nos enseña el Evangelio de Jesucristo que guía nuestro proceder.

Pido a todos los líderes políticos y a quienes toman decisiones que reconsideren y cesen inmediatamente estas tácticas, en favor de un planteamiento que respete los derechos humanos y la dignidad humana y conlleve a una reforma más amplia y duradera a nuestro sistema de inmigración.

Muchos salen a las calles para expresar su oposición a las actuales tácticas de las autoridades migratorias. Es su derecho constitucional, y hago un llamado a todos los manifestantes a que actúen sin vulgaridad, violencia en contra de otros ni daños a la propiedad. La decisión de desplegar tropas de la Guardia Nacional federal y efectivos militares a los lugares en que se dan las manifestaciones ha intensificado aún más la tensión en torno al tema. Por ahora, esto solo parece aumentar la ira y el miedo a la violencia en las calles.

Nuestro difunto Santo Padre, +Papa Francisco, me dijo una vez que su mayor temor era la división. De hecho, es doloroso ver tanta discordia entre el pueblo de Dios en estos momentos. Esto no es lo que Dios quiere para nosotros. Recordemos, más bien, lo que todos compartimos: el haber sido creados a su imagen y semejanza. Veamos a Dios en el hermano.

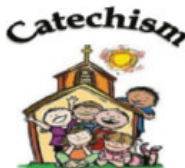

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Peace and well-being to you in these warming days of Summer. I write to you again on the very painful and challenging topic of immigration. We have seen a change and an increase in immigration enforcement in our region and specifically in our diocese. Authorities are now seizing brothers and sisters indiscriminately, without respect for their right to due process and their dignity as children of God. I say once again to our immigrant communities who are bearing the trauma and injustice of these tactics that your Church walks with you and supports you. We join you in carrying this very difficult cross.

While we surely respect and appreciate the right of law enforcement to keep our communities safe from violent criminals, we are now seeing agents detain people as they leave their homes, in their places of work and other randomly chosen public settings. We have experienced at least one case of ICE agents entering a parish property and seizing several people. It should be no surprise that this is creating a tremendous amount of fear, confusion and anxiety for many. It is not of the Gospel of Jesus Christ – which guides us in all that we do.

I ask all political leaders and decision-makers to please reconsider and cease these tactics immediately, in favor of an approach that respects human rights and human dignity and builds toward a more lasting, comprehensive reform of our immigration system.

Many are taking to the streets to voice their opposition to the current immigration enforcement tactics. It is their Constitutional right to do this, and I call on all protestors to act without vulgarity, violence toward others, or destruction of property. The tension around this issue has been further heightened by the decision to deploy federal National Guard troops and military personnel to the sites of these protests. At this point, this seems only to increase the level of anger and fear of violence in the streets.

Our late Holy Father, +Pope Francis, once told me that his greatest fear was division. Indeed, it is painful to see such division amongst God's people at this moment. This is not what He wants for us. Let us instead remember what we all share – our creation in His image and likeness. Let us look for God in one another.

We continue as Catholics in this Jubilee Year, called to carry the hope of Christ in our hearts and to share it with the world. We know this hope is an antidote to the strife and suffering in our communities. May it prevail over this division and may God's Kingdom come.

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St. Michael Prayer, Explained!

The prayer to St. Michael invokes the protection of the archangel Michael in the ongoing spiritual battle for the souls of all mankind. This prayer was composed by Pope Leo XIII and its use was instituted in 1886 at the end of Low Mass, a tradition which continued until the liturgical reforms of the Second Vatican Council. A popular story regarding its origin claims that the Pope wrote this prayer after having a vision of demonic spirits descending on Rome.

Michael is mentioned as one of God's seven archangels in the Book of Enoch and is presented by Revelations 12:7-12 as the warrior angel who cast Satan from heaven. He is therefore traditionally venerated as a protector against the forces of evil and a guardian of the Church.

The Prayer to St. Michael is still commonly said at the end of the rosary and by some parishes after the conclusion of Mass.

En Peregrinación

Antes de embarcarme en mi viaje al Congreso Eucarístico Nacional el verano pasado con un grupo de mi arquidiócesis, tuvimos una reunión de orientación. En esa reunión, el coordinador del viaje compartió con nosotros "Las Cinco Reglas de la Peregrinación".

Si no estás familiarizado con ellas (yo no), aquí están:

1. No te quejes.
2. No te quejes. (Es tan importante que aparece dos veces).
3. Cuando veas un baño, úsalo.
4. Cuando alguien te ofrezca algo, recíbelo.
5. Cuando alguien te pida algo, dáselo.

Son grandes consejos para una peregrinación, pero más que eso, creo que son grandes consejos en general. Así que cuando leí el Evangelio de hoy y escuche a Jesús decir esencialmente lo mismo a sus discípulos cuando se dispusieron a evangelizar (bueno, menos la ida al baño, pero eso no era tan importante en la Judea bíblica), me doy cuenta de algo importante.

Toda la vida cristiana es una peregrinación.

Con demasiada frecuencia, la vida no cumple con mis expectativas. Una oportunidad no funcionó. Un día no salió como lo planeé (en absoluto). Una persona no me aceptó. Y levanto los puños y pisoteo como una sal de Veruca adulta, y grito: ¡no puedo trabajar en estas condiciones!

Y entonces, me imagino a Dios, en su trono celestial, suspira y abre el Libro de los Evangelios (seguro que lo tiene a la mano, ¿no crees?) a Lucas, capítulo 10. Y susurra en mi corazón lo que les dijo a sus discípulos hace 2,000 años.

No te quejes. Sé abierto y da de ti misma, y a su vez, recibe lo que se te presente, sea lo que sea. Si es bueno, regocíjate. Si no es bueno, sigue adelante. Y al final, recuerda hacia dónde te diriges, el lugar al que intentas ir.

Ah, y de nuevo: no te quejes.

GOSPEL MEDITATION -

In the days after the awful 2020 killing of George Floyd, a Catholic friend remarked, "Racism is today's great evil. We should put all our energy into fighting it." I admired her intuition that the church must stand firmly against evil. Amen, I thought. At the same time, something felt wrong. As months went by, I saw her steadily slide into bitterness and anger. Soon, despondency. She spoke of giving up the fight. Don't we too wonder how to fight evil without losing our joy or energy?

Jesus' words this week help. He says, "**Rejoice not that you have power over demons, but that your names are written in heaven**" (Luke 10:20). Notice the asymmetry in where he wants our focus: on the latter, not the former. Should we confidently embrace our God-given power to overcome evil? Absolutely. But even more so, we should emphasize the positive element of our relationship to God. It is tempting but dangerous to define ourselves by what we oppose. It is better to define ourselves by—to rejoice in—what we celebrate: in Jesus, God has written our names in heaven. This sustains our battles.

This week, our marching orders are: fight evil. But more deeply, rejoice that God knows and loves us personally, individually. We allow this joyful knowledge to undergird our fight against the darkness of our day. Then we enjoy long-term stability to be cheerful warriors, who never forget the reason for the contests we are called to fight and win: love.
