Y5/6 HOME LEARNING







<u>Supporting Home Learning in Y5/6 - Arithmetic Practice Books</u>

In response to feedback from our recent parent survey, the school has now provided arithmetic practice books for all children in Years 5 and 6.

The books are titled:

- KS2 Maths Arithmetic Year 5: 10-Minute Weekly Workouts
- KS2 Maths Arithmetic Year 6: 10-Minute Weekly Workouts

These short, focused tasks are designed to help children build fluency and confidence in key number skills through regular, bite-sized practice. Just ten minutes a week helps children reinforce methods taught in class, improve accuracy and speed, and develop the automatic recall that supports success across all areas of maths.

This initiative aims to strengthen the link between home and school learning, giving families a clear, manageable way to support their child's ongoing mathematical progress and confidence.

Miss Gardner, ESM Maths Lead, says:

"These 10-minute workouts are a fantastic way for children to keep their maths skills sharp and to feel proud of their progress. A little regular practice makes a big difference - it helps build confidence and ensures children are ready to tackle new challenges in class."





Anti-Bullying Week 2025 - Power for Good

READING, SPELLING, TIMES TABLES HOME LEARNING EXPECTATIONS





Reading - We've had such a positive start to the year, and it's clear how much of a difference regular reading makes across all subjects. At school, we really value reading — it builds confidence, vocabulary, and imagination. Please support us by encouraging your child to read at home for around 20 minutes each day — whether it's sharing a story or enjoying a quiet read before bed. With the National Year of Reading 2026 on the way, now's the perfect time to build strong reading habits that will last a lifetime!

<u>Spelling</u> - We've had a great start to the year, and it's wonderful to see children taking pride in their spelling and writing. Across the school, we're focusing on building confident, accurate spellers through regular practice and the use of Spelling Shed at home. Just a few minutes of practice each day really helps children spot patterns, remember tricky words, and use them in their writing. Thank you for supporting your child with their spellings — we can already see the progress they're making!

Times Tables - Across Years 3-6, we're putting a strong focus on times tables this term. Quick recall of multiplication facts really helps children feel confident and capable in all areas of maths — from fractions to problem-solving. A few minutes of daily practice on Maths Shed, Mathsframe, or Topmarks can make a big difference and help keep those facts fresh. Thank you for supporting your child's learning at home — it's fantastic to see their confidence growing week by week!
