


ELY ST MARY'S NEWSLETTER - SPRING 1, 2026

Winter Clothing & Uniform Reminder

As we move into the winter months, please ensure your child brings a warm coat to school each day and wears footwear suitable for outdoor use.

We would also like to remind parents of key uniform expectations:

- Plain, flat black trainers, shoes or boots
- Neat hairstyles; long hair must be tied back, especially for PE/Games
- No make-up, nail varnish or fashion accessories (including novelty headbands)
- Navy blue jumpers; plain hoodies for PE/Games only
- No jewellery to be worn during PE/Games
- Pupils should come to school in their PE kit on PE/Games days

PE Safety:

Shin pads (football/hockey) and gum shields (rugby/hockey) are strongly recommended. Gum shields should be taken home and sanitised after each use.

Regular, short practice at home can make a real difference.
