Policy on Pupil Use of Mobile Phones in School

While mobile phones and personal communication devices are commonplace in today's society, it is recognised that personal mobile phones have the potential to be used inappropriately.

Pupils are dissuaded from bringing mobile phones to school. If it is deemed necessary for a pupil to bring a mobile phone to school, (e.g. in the case of older, Y5 and Y6, pupils because they travel to and from school independently), then the expectation is that the pupil hands their phone into the school office via their class box.

- In addition, parents must give consent for their child(ren) to bring their mobile phone into school. They do this via the online form found on the school website.

- Pupils are not permitted to use their phone or personal device during the school day/when on site. To do may present a number of safeguarding concerns. Where pupils deliberately do not follow this expectation, their behaviour will be considered and addressed in line with the school's behaviour policy.
- Mobile phones brought into school are at pupils' own risk.
