## The Alice Prize competition

Many years ago it was the dedicated aim of a group of Alice residents, looking to build and define the unique opportunities of living in the southern end of the Territory, to bring the best of contemporary Australian art to the Centre for both education and inspiration. This aim is as relevant and strong now as it was in the 60's.

These days many come to the Centre to view the unique 'response to place' displayed by our creative community, and we believe it just as important that our artists also have access to nationally diverse practices and pieces.

Our prize is acquisitive to provide an on-going source of contemporary practice display for Central Australian residents and visitors. It is conducted without the limitation of medium, genre, subject matter or theme letting creativity for the sake of artist expression speak for itself.

Our blind finalist selection process is searching for works of merit displaying: artistic strength and clarity, originality and risk, technical realisation and audience impact. Judging occurs in a gallery display space arranged curated by Araluen Arts Centre.

Acquired winners are added to The Alice Prize collection and all finalists and People's Choice awards are on display on The Alice Prize website <a href="https://www.aliceprize.com">www.aliceprize.com</a>.
