The garden contains a variety of trees, shrubs and perennials. A winding gravel path weaves between the borders, allowing easy access and views of the plants. The tall trees gave us welcome shade on the hot day of our visit.

There are many plants which are not usually found in a typical back garden such as the variegated Wedding Cake Tree, Holly-leaved sweet spire, with its long, tendrils of tiny, green flowers and a Pomegranate tree with small fruits.

Several bamboo, one of which is very tall, with stems thick enough to cut and use in a garden. Box hedges and topiary add formal structure here and there.

Our hosts offered explanations of the plants and some welcome gardening tips too.

There are several seating areas in the garden where we took refuge from the hot sun and enjoyed delicious refreshments.
