The Awards Banquet for Watercolor Ohio 2025 was held September 20, 2025 at the same place as the exhibition: Springfield Museum of Art. As usual, the evening started with a social hour, then dinner and awards. The Museum is in a lovely setting with windows and natural light. It was a great opportunity to see this year's exhibition and mingle with friends as we celebrated new signature members, the lifetime achievement award, and juror awards. Message from the Executive Board

There's a saying that the only constant in business is change.

The same applies to groups such as the OWS. Many opportunities exist to promote artists' work and those options have become more readily accessible because of online technology. Ohio artists therefore have many choices now that were not readily available in the past.

The Executive Board met in late October to assess the programs and finances of our Society as they relate to its mission, and it was clear that several changes are needed. Some are relatively straightforward while others will take work (and time) to implement.

At its core, the OWS has a stellar reputation among peer organizations. Artwork exhibited each year is exceptional; and many of our members compete successfully in national and international competitions, become members of other well-respected watercolor societies and have widespread reputations as excellent teachers. Our history is filled with innovative ventures such as the Creativity Seminars that have been recognized nationally. These are traits we don't want to lose.

Funding the Annual Juried Exhibition

Expenses for conducting Watercolor Ohio have increased in recent years—much like everything—yet we have not increased our income or trimmed spending. You should have received an email recently about donating to support the OWS, and we hope members will take to heart the urgent need at this time to adequately fund our undertakings.

The income sources (dues, fees, donations) to fund the exhibition are used to compensate the juror, pay for the venue/reception, furnish awards and print/mail the catalog. The workshop and banquet are meant to be self-supporting.

In order to bring income more in line with expenses, the Board approved two motions so far:

1. Institute a fee for submission to the annual exhibition. The fee for the first entry this year will be \$30 and the second will be reduced to \$10. We are probably the only competitive exhibition in the country that has not charged an entry fee in the past.

2. Print the exhibition catalog in a smaller format. With the ability to display online, we can supplement the catalog by presenting images, videos and even the catalog itself to viewers everywhere. For those who like viewing a hard copy, printed images will be sized like those in previous catalogs.

Elimination of the Travel Exhibition

At its July meeting the Board approved a motion to eliminate the Travel Exhibition. Though serving as a form of outreach for many years, the travel show has become too isolated (all recent venues have been only in western Ohio), too expensive to transport and dependent on too few people to move it. With use of technology, we can display images and videos of the entire exhibition online and the Board will explore other ways to promote the artwork displayed in the annual exhibition.

Exploring Outreach and Other Exhibitions

The Board began a preliminary discussion of ways to increase our footprint among watercolor/art organizations. In lieu of the travel show, for instance, the Board discussed displaying works in the Permanent Collection at sites around Ohio. These exhibits could last for longer periods than a typical travel show stop, and they could also be used to draw viewers to a venue to interact with our members by way of painting demonstrations or classes.

Another option under consideration is to hold additional exhibitions, notably online. Such shows could encourage entries from beyond our State's borders, although we would continue to hold the annual exhibition in the usual manner (Ohio residents) since it forms the basis for granting signature membership in the OWS. There is a larger world out there, but we cannot ignore our base within Ohio.

Participation of Members

No matter how we proceed, members need to be involved. We are fortunate that volunteers step up to do the tasks when exhibition time rolls around, but we are lacking in leadership and expertise in areas that are crucial to our future success. For example, a member with previous experience in marketing and/ or fundraising would be a godsend at this time to identify and contact people, businesses or organizations to provide financial support for our programs.

Paul Jackson Workshop Recap

Entries were accepted at the Springfield Museum of Art on July 26 and 27. The process went smoothly due to Tom Sorrell's organizational skills and in spite of a storm and power outage.

Paul Jackson's demo was in the afternoon on the 27th accompanied by a thunderstorm. Undaunted, he completed a painting in the two hour time frame.

Paul was accompanied by **Connie Gifford** as he made his award deliberations on Monday.

On Tuesday, Paul began his four day workshop with witticisms, stories and instructions. It was an intense workshop of directed, step-by-step painting procedure and process working from his reference material which was sent to us before the workshop. His reference drawing which we were to have transferred to our painting before the workshop looked like a topographic map of squiggles. But, all became clear as Paul guided us through the process, and everyone came away with a workshop painting they could be proud of.

He is a prodigious painter and loquacious speaker regaling us throughout the workshop with his adventures as a result of his career as an artist.

Thanks to the efforts of **Aileen Cave**, our workshop chairperson, the workshop experience was excellent and went smoothly.

Another deficiency is administrative leadership, which has shrunk to a handful of people, some of whom have served more years than is healthy because it leads to tunnel vision and complacency. We added three new trustees this year to the Board, but we still lack a President and someone to conduct the annual exhibition after 2026.

While Associates can serve as trustees or as chairpersons for the annual exhibition and related programs, the officer positions must be filled by Signature members. Soon we will need to identify someone to serve as webmaster and others as registrars for membership and exhibitions. It might be necessary to hire someone to maintain the website, but that of course will require additional funding.

The challenges that the OWS is facing are affecting other art organizations but that cannot be an excuse to sit back and hope for better. We need to confirm our mission and then act to pursue it.


Gary Brooks won the Dr. Maynard Stetten Award at the 2025 Kentucky Aqueous Show.


