Reader: God of light and life, as your Word became flesh and lived among us, so now let your Holy Spirit be reborn within us and prepare our hearts for the festive celebration of the coming Christmas season.

They have walked for six days to come to this city where King David was born, so long ago. They have come, like so many others, because the Roman emperor wants to count each one, so he can take their money as a tax. But it is late, and Mary is so weary. Where will they sleep? There is no room in the inn. They decide to sleep in the stable.

Lo, how a Rose e'er blooming, from tender stem hath sprung! Of Jesse's lineage coming as seers of old have sung. It came, a blossom bright, amid the cold of winter, when half spent was the night.

Stars brighten slowly in the sky. All creation holds its breath. Suddenly, from the stable, comes the cry of a newborn child! Mary gently wraps the baby in a blanket and lays him in the feed box that his father has filled with straw. In the hills outside Bethlehem, shepherds watch their sheep. All at once, the dark is lost in light, and in the midst of the light is something even brighter: the faces of the angels. The fearful shepherds then hear music in the sky, and a voice cries, "Do not be afraid. Listen, I bring you news of great joy, a joy to be shared by all people. Today in the City of David a Savior is born! He is Christ the Lord." Then more angels appear, a whole heavenly host of them, praising God and singing, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth, peace, good will to all!" The shepherds run with joy across the fields to Bethlehem to the barn behind the inn. There they find the Holy Family and creep forward, overwhelmed with mystery, to find the Christ Child.

A Word about Holy Communion

- If you would rather not drink out of the common cup, come to the pulpit side of the altar, where the clergy person will dip your wafer in the wine.

Gluten-free wafers are available. Just let clergy know that you need one. In lieu of communion, you may receive a blessing at any station.

Candles for Silent Night

- On your way back from communion, please pick up a candle for the singing of *Silent Night*.
- Battery-operated candles are available for young children. Parents, please wait to turn on the children's candles until the other candles in your pew have been lit. Turn on the light by twisting the "flame".
