- Reviewing parish financial reports compared to budget.
- Reviewing, approving, and signing the year-end report submitted to the bishop.

The council consists of the pastor, deacon, business manager and members of the parish with expertise in matters of finance or civil law Current members are Jeremy Armbruster, Tim Pieper, Andy Hagedorn, John Wood, Kathy Papas, Darla Kettenacker, and Paul Meier.

## BEREAVEMENT MINISTRY

The death of a loved one is a time of grief, but it is also an opportunity to gather family and friends to celebrate their life. We are fortunate at St. Barbara to have a Bereavement Ministry that plans the funeral Mass and hosts a reception. Knowing that our parish is there to support them during this difficult time is a great comfort to the family of the deceased.

After a parishioner passes away, either a loved one or the funeral home contacts the parish office. The family and Father John then determine the date and time of the funeral. The family meets with Deacon Chuck Melville or Laura Scheben at the parish office to discuss the funeral arrangements. During this meeting, information is collected about the deceased, including their place of baptism, date of death, names of immediate family members, and any specific details that will help shape the homily. The family chooses the two readings, the Gospel, and the songs to be used during the Mass of Christian Burial. Typically, the family provides the readers and gift bearers. The parish arranges for musicians, altar servers, and ministers for Communion unless the family will provide these ministers. The family is asked for an estimate of how many people are expected to attend the funeral Mass and reception. Once all information is collected, the funeral program is prepared and printed by the parish office. On the day of the funeral, a sacristan prepares the church and assists during the Mass.

Our parish also offers to host a reception after the funeral Mass. The parish office sends the expected number of attendees to Erika Geiger and her committee, who handle the details for the reception. The parish provides a meal that includes meat sandwiches, baked beans, deviled eggs, pickles, and cheese potatoes. A group of volunteers prepares these dishes in the Sterling Event Center kitchen on the day before the funeral. There are 46 people that Amy Hahnel can contact to bring additional side dishes and desserts. About a dozen people are also willing to help with serving food or bartending at the receptions. It's wonderful to have a large team to call on, especially when there are several funerals in a short span and to ensure coverage when volunteers are out of town.

If you would like to join Bereavement Committee, please contact the parish office. The parish is also able to support the committee with donations at the annual Bake Sale, which helps to offset the costs of the funeral receptions.

### Stewardship Spotlight

Bill and Amy Hahnel joined the parish in the summer of 2002. It was an easy decision and transition as Bill's sister and family were longtime parishioners. When their three children were young, the family was not too involved at the parish but would help with the Parish Kitchen and Action Ministries. Amy likes the community outreaches, but the



church ministries are most special. Later, they became involved with "Kool Kids" and then the Youth Group at St. Barbara. Bill drove their truck as the "pack mule" on many youth trips. They became more involved with liturgical ministries: both as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, the Vocations Crucifix, and Amy as a Lector. For the parish bereavement committee, Amy organizes the food and is the backup coordinator for funeral receptions and Bill bartends as needed. For many years, the Hahnels have organized the Soup & Bread Supper on Holy Thursday. Amy also participates in the Walking with Purpose bible study. In the fall, Bill is usually found working Holy Name Turkey Shoots and Amy has been active with the festival Bid-n-Buy. Around the parish campus, Amy cleans the church with the Altar Society, Bill works with the Spare Time Parishioners, and both assist with the Christmas decorations at church.

When Amy was a child, her family's house burned and the community support received created a desire to help people when able. This experience led Amy to be a volunteer firefighter and an EMT. It also led her to help with the Giving Tree after joining the parish. This annual program was managed by SVdP until 2013, when the Hahnels "took it over" as a parish ministry. Amy shared that "We enjoy being able to help so many families and children at Christmas and seeing the relief these families have when they pick up their gifts is a gift to us. It is wonderful to have our adult children and spouses now help us with this ministry."

Since Bill is retired and Amy works part-time as needed from home, they "are beyond blessed to be able to watch our grandchildren, a gift to our children as well as a gift to us."

Their two daughters' families attend Mass with them and daughter Katherine regularly sings as part of the music ministry at the 9 AM Mass. In their "spare time", Bill likes to work outside, putter around the garage/basement, and reading. Amy enjoys cooking, reading, sewing, and quilting.

Thank you to Bill and Amy Hahnel for inspiring us and sharing about their parish ministries and community activities. Our parish has been beyond blessed with their stewardship!
