Our History

The Association of Black Women Physicians (ABWP) was founded in 1982. Almost 50 African-American women physicians met to share their experiences and to discuss career development at the first meeting held in the recreation room of Dr. Jessie Sherrod's home. The need for such an organization was abundantly clear, and the founders of our organization were women who passionately worked together for the organization. Over the course of a few months, members adopted the official name, transformed their goals into a mission statement, established Bylaws and began actively engaging in organized community service programs and philanthropic endeavors.

Over the past 40 years, ABWP has grown to represent African-American women physicians, medical students and undergraduate students throughout California, the United States and the Caribbean. Focused primarily in Southern California, the nonprofit organization has made an impact in local communities through health literacy programs, community outreach activities, mentoring and scholarship awards. All of our programs and services facilitate fulfillment of our mission:

President's MESSAGE

On behalf of the Association of Black Women Physicians (ABWP), I welcome you to our 41st Annual Charity & Scholarship Benefit Gala aptly themed Regal & Revolutionary: 40 Years of Boldly Advocating for Health Equity and Justice.

For over four decades, the Association of Black Women Physicians (ABWP) has been the leader in medicine and public health, advocating for women physicians of color and the patients who trust us. The mission set forth by our Founding Members remains the same though our approach has evolved to keep pace with the changing times. The Association from its inception has focused on serving black and brown communities, recognizing the disparate representation of African-Americans among the physician workforce and the issues of inequity in medical care delivery systems that have long plagued us. Black women physicians have held their crowned heads high while executing the revolutionary work of challenging the status quo, unafraid to upset the "natural" order to achieve our goals.

Queenly, dignified, our member roster is replete with regal revolutionaries in healthcare such as the first African American woman astronaut, Dr. Mae Jemison, the Inventors Hall of Fame inductee who transformed cataract surgery, Dr. Patricia Bath, and Dr. Josephine Isabel-Jones, ABWP Founding Member and the first black woman Pediatric Cardiologist in the United States! Wearing white hospital coats as capes, these trailblazers defied the odds and demonstrated the beauty of excellence in diversity.

Since our last Charity Benefit, ABWP members received special recognition on myTurn.CA.gov throughout the Black History Month observance for our unwavering educational and advocacy work in the fight against COVID-19 during the California Department of Public Health's Keep It 100 campaign.

Through our partnerships with the March of Dimes and First 5 LA, Alzheimer's Association, Maria Shriver & the Women's Alzheimer's Movement, the UCLA Center for the Study of Racism, Social Justice & Health, and Gilead Sciences, ABWP established programs to combat health disparities and the public health crisis of racism. We continued to pursue equity in Black infant and maternal health while amplifying the forgotten pandemic at the other end of the lifespan, Alzheimer's dementia in the Black community. ABWP's advocacy efforts have raised awareness about the need to stop generations of institutional racism in healthcare by advancing Black participation in research, not only in the Alzheimer's space, but also regarding sickle cell disease, ensuring greater access to treatments. Our members showed up and showed out at the first KJLH Women's Health Expo since the pandemic, an opportunity to educate our core community on how to navigate a complicated healthcare system.

ABWP influenced policy efforts by endorsing tobacco and gun violence reform and stood in solidarity with the reproductive justice movement after the overturning of Roe v. Wade, a decision that left far fewer options for anyone seeking safe reproductive healthcare in low-income and rural communities. ABWP prioritized our student members through the enhancement of our Sister-2-Sister Program, offering mentor-match experiences to our members across the nation. We've also donated to other like-minded nonprofits, including attorney activist Areva Martin's Special Needs Network, and the Jenesse Center for domestic abuse treatment.

All of these noble endeavors did not go unnoticed. ABWP recently was awarded the prestigious Frank E. Staggers, Sr., M.D., Outstanding Ethnic Physician Organization Award by the Physicians for a Healthy California (PHC) for "taking significant action in improving the health of our communities, successfully engaging physicians to be community advocates, and reducing health disparities!" As President, I am in awe of what we have been able to achieve building on the vision of the regal and revolutionary Black women physicians that came before us!

This evening is a celebration of all that is good in our industry. Congratulations to our Lifetime Achievement Award honoree, Dr. Barbara Ross-Lee, and Humanitarian of the Year honoree, Dr. Jerry P. Abraham! The Association of Black Women Physicians commends your exemplary promotion of health equity and contributions to public health. Additionally, congratulations to the future leaders of ABWP and healthcare — our scholarship recipients! You have a family for life in ABWP.

We appreciate the work of our Chairwoman, President-Elect Dr. Renee M. Poole, our Charity Benefit committee volunteers, and all who contributed to the success of this year's program! Your efforts allow our continued success.

Fundraising initiatives like today's telecast have provided much-needed scholarships to academically outstanding Black women to help reduce the financial burden of pursuing a medical degree. hristopher "Chris" Tucker, is an American actor and comedian. Tucker was born in Atlanta, Georgia, to Mary Louise (Bryant) and Norris Tucker.

After graduating from high school, Tucker made a change to move to Hollywood from Georgia to pursue a career in show business. He found himself a frequent guest on the Def Comedy Jam (1992). Tucker was noted for doing exceptionally "clean", non-vulgar stand-up comedy routines. Tucker states his inspirations for comedy are Eddie Murphy and Richard Pryor.

Tucker made his film debut in House Party 3 (1994), alongside stars such as Bernie Mac, Marques Houston, and Khandi Alexander. In 1995 Tucker appeared in one of his most notable and hilarious films, Friday (1995), alongside Ice Cube. Tucker's character,

Smokey, was a drug addict who was an energetic and outlandish person. Films such as Friday (1995) showed Tucker's television-comedy styling was very different from his stand-up. In 1995, Tucker also appeared in in another film, Dead Presidents (1995).

1997 was the busiest year of Tucker's career. He starred in three hit movies all in the same year: The Fifth Element (1997), Money Talks (1997), and Jackie Brown (1997). Tucker co-starred and exec. produced Money Talks with Charlie Sheen and appeared in Luc Besson's The Fifth Element before beginning work on the highly commercially successful Rush Hour films playing the role of Detective James Carter.

Rush Hour (1998) grossed more than \$200 million worldwide. This resulted in two additional sequels, Rush Hour 2 (2001) and Rush Hour 3 (2007). In 2006, Tucker got a deal on his Rush Hour 3 (2007) contract that paid \$25 million, making him the highest-paid actor in Hollywood at that time.

In 2001, Tucker also was in a music video with friend, pop legend Michael Jackson, in the music video, "You Rock My World."

In 2012, Tucker appeared in the Oscar nominated film "Silver Lining Playbook" with Robert DeNiro, Jennifer Lawrence and Bradley Cooper.

Tucker is also a humanitarian and spends much of his spare time traveling and working with his foundation. ABWP thanks him for his generous support of his time and contributions.







Dr. Ross-Lee is the first African American woman to serve as dean of a United States medical school (Ohio University Heritage College of Osteopathic Medicine, 1993 - 2001). She is also the first osteopathic physician to participate in the Robert Wood Johnson Health Policy

Fellowship. Dr. Ross-Lee served as a commissioned officer, United States Naval Reserves Medical Corps, achieving the rank of Captain. She lectures both nationally and internationally and has published numerous scholarly articles on a variety of medical and healthcare issues. She is the recipient of nine honorary degrees and many national awards. Most recently, the ACGME Annual Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Award was named the Barbara Ross-Lee, DO DEI Award in her honor.

Ross-Lee has served as: Chair of the American Association of Colleges of Osteopathic Medicine (AACOM) Council of Presidents; Chair of the American Osteopathic Association (AOA) Council on Pre-doctoral Education (pre-dating COCA); and Chair of the Board of the Association of Academic Health Centers (AAHC). In 2012, Dr. Ross-Lee was appointed by the Institute of Medicine to serve as a member of the Consensus Committee on the Governance and Financing of GME which was responsible for recommending reforms to the GME system. Dr. Ross-Lee assumed the position of President-elect of the American Osteopathic Foundation in January 2021 and currently serves as President of the AOF effective January 2022.



Dr. Jerry P. Abraham serves as an advocate for equal access to public health and healthcare for all people across Los Angeles. Throughout his time working as the Director & Chief Vaccinologist of Kedren Vaccines + Kedren Mobile, he has fought for several minority groups' right to reliable and nondiscriminatory treatment including advocacy for Black, LatinX, Asian/Pacific Islander, American Indian-Native Alaskan, and LGBTQIA+ communities. Through a mixture of avid social activism, dedicated community outreach, and an extensive history of medical experience, Dr. Abraham has spent his career working to innovate and democratize healthcare delivery in order to put patients first and to break down institutional barriers that keep underserved groups from receiving care.

Dr. Abraham is a graduate of multiple medical institutions including the Emory University Rollins School of Public Health, Harvard University School of Public Health, The University of Texas School of Medicine, and the University of Southern California Keck School of Medicine. On top of his educational history, he is also a leader of several prestigious organizations such as Councilor of the American Medical Association, member of the American Public Health Association, Delegate of the United States Pharmacopeia, Trustee of the California Medical Association, President-Elect of the Los Angeles County Medical Association, and many more.

He serves on the Faculty of the Charles Drew University School of Medicine, the UCLA David Geffen School of Medicine, and the USC Keck School of Medicine. As Director of Kedren Vaccines: A Division of Kedren Community Health Center Inc., he has fully repositioned Kedren Health to serve as the lead responder for COVID-19 testing, vaccinations, and therapeutics in Los Angeles County providing over 450,000 tests and over 300,000 vaccines with a keen focus to South Los Angeles, earning international and national acclaim. His program has allowed residents of underprivileged neighborhoods, those without reliable transportation, and people experiencing homelessness to be provided access not only to the vaccine itself but also a reliable patient education on vaccination safety. This effort has saved countless lives, and further kept the community

safe in these unprecedented times. Dr. Abraham has also won several awards for his dedicated clinical work including the 2021 Hero of Family Medicine Award for his passionate advocacy for patients, colleagues, and the family medicine specialty. He has also been acknowledged for his community-based efforts receiving the 2022 Community Service Award from the California Department of Public Health, the Compassionate Physician of the Year from the California Medical Association CMA, and the Gay Men's Chorus of Los Angeles GMCLA Voice Award. In addition to his many awards and recognitions, he has also gained public esteem via multiple media appearances on national news sources such as CNN, MBC, MSNBC, and more.

His passion for furthering the rights of underserved and underrepresented communities and expanding the bounds of traditional medical care as well as his deep love for the people of Los Angeles has shaped his career. Dr. Abraham will continue to be one of the driving forces in the overall efforts to improve the public access to healthcare for all people.

Dr. Abraham specializes in the care of people experiencing housing insecurity, patients with substance use & addiction, the care of migrant workers, the treatment of chronic pain in vulnerable populations, delivering high-quality primary care to severely mentally ill patients, reintegration and re-entry care for patients with histories of incarceration. I grew up the third born out of six children in a suburban Southern California town. My father is a military veteran from the Lower 9th Ward in New Orleans. My mother is a homemaker from South Sudan who came to America in the 1980's. For my parents, providing educational opportunities for their children in America meant assimilating by physically distancing themselves from almost every aspect that defined their identities and culture. My awareness of how my parents assimilated and the severe lack of racial diversity in my hometown pushed me to look at the American educational ecosystem. Because I was the only Black student in my high school advanced placement courses, I understood that attending universities with more socioeconomically diverse populations would show me

opportunities for deeper self-acceptedness and how to care for the less fortunate. When I was seven years old, I traumatically lost the vision in my left eye. Several months later, I was fitted with a prosthetic eye with a tiny red flower printed on the very top. For the next ten years, I would have more doctor visits than all my siblings combined. My healthcare team's commitment to ensuring that my loss didn't limit my capabilities ignited my curiosity into medicine. That flower eventually dug its roots into my future and blossomed into my intention to practice medicine so I could affect the lives of many in the same profound way mine had been. My path was clear; I wanted to be a doctor.

Shami-Iyabo Mitchell spent her early years in Cleveland, Ohio with her father, mother, and sister and is a resident of California. Ms.Mitchell received her masters in bioethics from Columbia University as a means of identifying and appropriately addressing her own personal bias prior to entering the field of medicine. She hopes to use an interdisciplinary lens to serve the needs of patients from underserved backgrounds.

Her professional, academic, and personal pursuits are centered around her commitment to health advocacy in under-resourced communities. Growing up in East Cleveland where the median household income was 22,000 and where there was limited access to medical care, she found numerous ways of connecting and volunteering with her community then and now as a second year medical student in the UCLA/CDU PRIME Medical Education Program including being a math

teacher for adult learners, volunteering for Black Women for Wellness, the Atlanta Food Bank, the Emory Autism center, and coordinating a vaccine site amid the COVID-19 pandemic.

Ms.Mitchell's most rewarding experience stems from the efforts she's made to reestablish trust of medicine and research within her community. Growing up in an underserved community with a historical mistrust of the healthcare system has allowed Ms.Mitchell to be more empathetic and understanding of the systems of socialization that can harm the health of many patients. She hopes to give a voice to the voiceless communities negatively impacted by the lack of access to resources which could inform their health status.



MARIANMU OSUMAH

Growing up, Marianmu did not always have the resources to help her excel in school, so she had to transition into a self-sufficient learner because that is what was required. In middle school, Marianmu willingly sacrificed her lunch periods to ask her teacher clarifying questions about the course material. Since she was young, she has been adamant about understanding challenging subjects. Her zeal for knowledge has enabled her to progress through school and grow confident in her abilities. Though Marianmu was frequently the only Black student in her classes, making her feel she needed to prove she was there for good reason, she was able to graduate from the University of California, Los Angeles with a dual degree in Neuroscience and African-American studies. Her training in Neuroscience encouraged her to seek information and use logic, while African American studies provided her a keen understanding of the multidimensionality of human existence, as well as helped her build a strong foundation in critical thinking. A combination of qualities that have

allowed her to understand the scientific basis of medical research and remain inclusive while practicing medicine.

As an adult in the workplace, she learned to speak up for herself, though cognizant that many people would be put off by a vocal, Black woman, imagining her to be "angry." Marianmu's experiences were intimidating and sometimes hurtful, but pushed her to develop courage and become a stronger person and communicator. As a Black woman, she has had her competence and worthiness questioned. As a student of critical Black theory, she learned about the ways Black, female, or low-income patients are overlooked by doctors. Now as a member of a historically underrepresented group within medicine, Marianmu is working to gracefully combat historical trends and be amongst a generation of doctors who can finally remedy this disparity. As COVID-19 claims a disproportionate number of lives of color, awareness of health inequity is more crucial than ever.

Scotti is originally from Detroit, Michigan, where she attended Wayne State University, obtaining a Bachelor of Science in the Biological Sciences in 2019. The Association of Black Women Physicians (ABWP) established the Rebecca Lee Davis Crumpler, MD Scholarship Awards in recognition of the first Black woman physician in the United States. Dr. Crumpler graduated from New England Female Medical College in 1864, one year before the end of slavery. The scholarship provides assistance to women medical students, and is awarded based on academic merit, financial need and commitment to the ABWP mission, "...improving public health and welfare through the advancement of knowledge concerning women and community health." Deep appreciation is extended to our donors, supporters and friends whose efforts have enabled us to give over \$600,000 in scholarship awards since 1982.

CARMEN PARROTT MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Dr. Carmen Parrott was a practicing dermatologist in Los Angeles, CA. She grew up in Maryland and completed her training at University of Pennsylvania. After establishing her practice in Los Angeles, Dr. Parrott was very active and engaged with the Association of Black Women Physicians, including a leadership position on the executive board. She was kind, passionate, engaging and a friend to everyone she met. Her humble and kind spirit combined with her brilliance and skill left an indelible impression on the organization. A memorial scholarship in her name was initially established by her mother who understood her commitment to ABWP, and it has continued to be funded by members of the organization each year since its inception.

ANNA SMITH MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Dr. Smith was a beloved psychiatrist and an Association of Black Women Physicians lifetime member. She also raised a daughter, Dr. Anne Staveren, who is a charter member and past-president of the organization. Dr. Smith was dedicated to addressing disparities in mental health for people of color and enhancing wellness in underserved communities. Her memorial scholarship was created to honor her career and commitment to these concerns and is meant to support a student with similar passion and dedication.






