





My dearest parishioners,

I greet you with love and peace in the name of Jesus!

Over the past few months, some of you have come to me with heavy hearts, asking for prayers for your sons, daughters, or other loved ones who seem to be drifting away from the Church. I want you to know that I hear you. And please know that I carry each of these intentions with me in my daily prayers. With that, I would like to let you know about a ministry we already have here in the parish called *Monica's Mission*. This ministry was initiated by our two deacons: *Pete and John*, along with Megan and Tom Blue. It was inspired by St. Monica, the mother of St. Augustine. She spent years praying for her son to come back to God, and her prayers were answered.

Monica's Mission is for anyone who carries this kind of burden, the pain of seeing a loved one walk away from their faith. Think of it like a support group, but one that's deeply rooted in prayer. It's a space where your story is safe and your pain is understood. If this resonates with you, I really encourage you to reach out to Deacon Pete or Deacon John. Whether you are ready to be part of the group or just need someone to talk to, they are here for you. The whole ministry is here for you.

Moving forward, let's keep praying for our loved ones. Let's not lose hope. Like St. Monica, let's trust that God never stops working in the hearts of those we love, even when we cannot see it yet. God bless you!

# October is the Month of the Rosary

The Rosary is an **important and powerful prayer**, given to us by the Blessed Virgin Mary herself, as a gift to St. Dominic in the early 1200s.

The Rosary was an answer to his prayers for help at the time.

The Rosary has also been a **tool used for protection against any and all foes**. In 1571, a Catholic fleet was being attacked by a strong opponent. St. Pope Pius V asked for all of Europe to pray the Rosary for the fleet's safety and victory. The Catholic fleet won! This victory took place in October of that year. Since then, October has been associated with the Rosary, specifically with the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary (October 7th).

The Rosary initially consisted of **fifteen Mysteries**. In 2002, St. Pope John Paul II added **five new Mysteries**.

THE JOYFUL MYSTERIES FOCUS ON CHRIST'S EARTHLY BEGINNING.
THE LUMINOUS MYSTERIES FOCUS ON CHRIST'S EARTHLY MINISTRY.
THE SORROWFUL MYSTERIES FOCUS ON CHRIST'S PASSION.
THE GLORIOUS MYSTERIES FOCUS ON CHRIST'S VICTORY OVER DEATH.

While the Rosary focuses on Christ's life, it begins and ends with our Blessed Mother.

The first Joyful Mystery is the Annunciation, where our Blessed Mother gave her "yes" to God's plan. The fifth and final Glorious Mystery is the Crowning of Mary Queen of Heaven, where she reigns with her Son, Jesus Christ.

Without our Blessed Mother, Christ's life – and our salvation – would not be possible.



**Gratitude** is the key to a stewardship way of life. Today's readings demonstrate the power and vital importance of gratitude in the life of the Christian disciple, for gratitude leads us to worship God who offers us salvation.

We see the power of gratitude on display in the Gospel passage from Luke after Jesus heals ten lepers. "And one of them, realizing he had been healed, returned." Only one of the ten recognized the tremendous blessing he had received from Jesus and returned to



thank him. While it's easy to feel indignant at the failure of the nine others to return and thank Jesus, how often do we fail to recognize the blessings, answered prayers, and healings (both physical and spiritual) that the Lord showers upon us, day and night?

The truth is that our very lives and every breath we take are His gift to us. But we can get so caught up in the stresses and distractions of daily life that we lose touch with this truth.

The Samaritan reacts to his gift of healing with the proper response to our loving God. Recognizing what he had just received from the Lord, he "returned, glorifying God in a loud voice; and he fell at the feet of Jesus and thanked Him." He was grateful for what God had done for him, and this gratitude led to worship. And because of this response, Jesus offered him a far more precious gift than physical healing; He offered him the gift of salvation. "Stand up and go; your faith has saved you."

Too often, we hear the phrase, "Count your blessings," and write it off as nothing more than a trite saying. Today's Gospel shows us otherwise. Gratitude is powerful. It deepens our faith in God and leads us to fitting worship of Him.

### Pro-Life Testimony

Many women who take the abortion pill soon realize they made a big mistake...and they would do anything to save their babies. Fortunately, many of them can. Abortion Pill Reversal (APR) sounds too good to be true, but it has saved thousands of babies worldwide.

A first-time mom in Fayetteville, North Carolina, visited Planned Parenthood for the abortion pill. As she left the appointment, she spoke with prayer warriors, who gave her APR information. The seeds planted that day sprouted the next morning, when the woman woke up filled with regret. She visited the local pregnancy center to ask for help reversing her abortion.

The doctor wasn't in, so Fayetteville 40 Days for Life leader Felisha drove the worried mom 90 minutes to the next closest APR doctor. Felisha also drove the mom to the pharmacy to get her prescription, took her to breakfast, and accompanied her to a prenatal appointment.

"Hearing the strong heartbeat of her sweet baby was an experience I'll never forget," Felisha recalled. "Her baby is a fighter, and we'll forever be a part of his story." The expectant mother doesn't have her own transportation, so 40 Days for Life volunteers are taking her to all of her doctor's appointments.

"She just entered her second trimester," Felisha said. "She is doing great. Our community has stepped up to surround her with love and convinced her to make a baby registry. She's been sending me "thank you" messages because items are already arriving."






