



From Your Pastor

My dearest parishioners,

I greet you with love and peace in the name of Jesus!

I have noticed that some people leave the church right after receiving Holy Communion. I know life gets busy: maybe you have places to go, family concerns, or work responsibilities, and I truly get that. But it's important that we pause and reflect: what are we missing when we leave Mass early?

The Mass is not complete without the final blessing and dismissal. Those last moments are not just formalities, they actually mean something important. The word Mass comes from the Latin phrase **Ite missa est**, which means: *Go, you are sent*. What began as a simple dismissal has become the Church's missionary call: *to go forth, transformed by the Eucharist, and bring Christ into the world*.

When we leave early, we miss this essential part of the liturgy. It's like walking out of a movie before the ending, leaving a friend's house before they say goodbye, or receiving a beautiful gift but never learning how to use it.

The final blessing is where Christ, through the priest, sends you back into the world with His grace. It is your commissioning moment, your time to say: *Here I am, Lord. Use me as Your instrument*.

So, out of love and pastoral care, I warmly invite you to stay until the very end of Mass, until you hear those powerful words: *Go in peace*. Let us complete our worship together. Let us receive everything Jesus wants to give us, not only the Eucharist, but also the mission that comes with it. Because when you walk out of those church doors, you are not just leaving, you are being sent. God bless you!

WE CELEBRATE AND REMEMBER THOSE WHO HAVE GONE BEFORE US.

Halloween
OCTOBER 31ST

Halloween is often associated with the secular world today, but it has its origins in the Catholic faith. In fact, the name "Halloween" originated from the term "All Hallows' E'en [Evening]". Just as we often celebrate and anticipate Christmas on Christmas Eve, Halloween began as a way of celebrating and anticipating All Saints Day. While it has morphed into a worldly "holiday" today, its origins are sacred.

All Saints Day is a Solemnity – the highest celebration in the Church's calendar. In fact, this celebration is so important that it is a Holy Day of Obligation. (However, in 2025, the Solemnity falls on a Saturday, so there is not an obligation to attend this year.)

This Solemnity celebrates <u>all</u> saints: the saints who have been canonized (people we know to be in heaven) and all of the holy men and women in heaven whom we don't know about.

All Paints Day



All Souls Day is <u>not</u> a Solemnity. Rather, it is a day where **we pray for all of the faithful departed**.

All Pouls Day
NOVEMBER 2ND

On All Souls Day, we especially pray for the souls in purgatory. These souls are seeking purification, that they might one day join the saints in heaven and be with our Lord.

Join us in celebrating these sacred days by bringing images of your late loved ones to Mass on Sunday, November 2nd, where we will pray for the repose of their souls.







Pro-Life Testimony

Some abortion-bound moms encounter a 40 Days for Life Vigil, choose life, and go along their way. Others need considerable ongoing support.

Atlanta 40 Days for Life leader **Cathy recently empowered a pregnant mother to choose life**, but a checkered past involving drug use, a prostitution charge, and a felony conviction left the woman ineligible for some of the support services she needed to turn her life around and follow through on her life decision. Cathy wouldn't let her slip through the cracks. She put the woman up in a hotel—and then got to work to find longer-term answers.

"I called this maternity home and explained how much this mom wants a 'do over," Cathy recounted. "They were willing to talk to her in spite of her past." After a phone interview, Cathy drove the expectant mother hours away to an in-person interview. The conversation went well, and the maternity home agreed to take the mom in. "We got her things from the ghetto apartment she was staying in previously," Cathy shared. "While we were there, we saw her pimp and literally had to run away from him."

While the mother--suffering from extreme nausea--prepared to move into the maternity home, Cathy set up a doctor's appointment, picked up a prescription, and acquired food and supplies for her. When Cathy brought the mom to the maternity home, the two women parted with hugs and tears.

"She's so happy," Cathy said. "I know she will be so loved on. Praise God this woman is in a stable, loving environment--what a beautiful start for a new life for this mom!"




