





From Your Pastor

My dearest parishioners,

I greet you with love and peace in the name of Jesus!

Today, I would like us to take a quiet moment to remember those who have gone before us in faith: our parents, grandparents, siblings, friends, and even those forgotten souls who might not have anyone left to pray for them. We don't do this just because it's a tradition. It's more than that. It's a reminder that we are called to pray for them, and to keep them close in our hearts.

We forget sometimes, don't we? Life gets busy, and we move on. But those prayers we whisper for our loved ones still matter. Every prayer, every Mass offered, and every candle lit is an act of love that never goes to waste.

As we remember them today, let us also think about the good they left behind: how they loved us, the sacrifices they made, and the kindness they showed. Many of them taught us how to live well, how to forgive, and how to trust God even when things were hard. Let their memory guide us to live with more love and faith. And you know, this remembering should not just happen once a year. Let's make it part of our daily walk with God: to pray for those who have passed, to offer Masses for them, to light candles and to quietly say their names in prayer.

I still remember lighting a candle for my grandparents last November, and I was struck again by how close they still feel. That's the beauty of our faith. Through the Communion of Saints, we are still connected. Death might take them from our sight for a time, but it cannot take away the love that binds us together. So today, and every day, let us keep that connection alive through our memories, our love, and our prayers. "Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace." Amen.

CONFESSION



In his first pastoral letter "Make", Bishop Ronald Hicks encourages all of us to embrace the calling to make disciples. This means that we are meant to transform people into followers of Christ – people who know, love, and serve Him. But we must first make sure that <u>we</u> are followers of Christ, so that we are <u>able</u> to share Him with others.

How are we meant to do this? Bishop Hicks provides us with five simple ways:

- 1) Conversion: Bishop Hicks explains that Conversion is a particular moment "when you realize that God is real and not just a theory." He goes on to explain that it is possible to go through the motions of faith, but not really believe. Conversion is a change of mind and heart, where we truly believe in Christ and are intentional about following Him.
- 2) Confession: The Sacrament of Confession is God's way of bringing us back to Him. Bishop Hicks explains that all of us fall into sin, but Christ's Death and Resurrection overpowered the effects of sin. By going to Confession, we are able to receive Christ's grace and "live freely as beloved children of God."
- 3) Communion: The Eucharist (Holy Communion) is the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Christ. By receiving the Eucharist, we are, quite literally, able to unite ourselves with Christ Himself, and "we receive the grace and power to go on mission as [Christ's] disciple-makers."
- 4) Commission: At the end of Mass, we "are sent forth to bring the fruits of the Eucharist to the world." More than just saying that the Mass is over, we are called to live our lives and to do good works in Christ's name wherever we are.
- 5) Prayer: This is our way of communicating with God. It is more than a chore to check off of a list. It is "the heartbeat of our whole journey to live in union with Jesus."

With Prayer as the unifying bond, Conversion, Confession, Communion, and Commission become a cycle to follow, which motivates us to preach the Gospel and "to shine the light of the Gospel for all to see". Bishop Hicks writes that we do not need to travel far to do this – that we can share the Gospel with people in our own families, workplaces, and local communities, and, in doing so, make disciples.

In order to do this and make others into disciples, however, we must first make ourselves into disciples. Make time for God – for prayer, for Mass, for the Eucharist. When we make our world centered on God, it becomes easier to live as examples for others to follow. We then can make disciples by "being on fire with love for Jesus", and by sharing that love with others in all that we do.

We encourage you to download and read the entirety of Bishop Hick's new pastoral letter, MAKE, to discover how to live as a disciple and help make other disciples in your community.
