

From Your Pastor

My dearest parishioners,

I greet you with love and peace in the name of Jesus!

A month ago, I wrote in the bulletin about how important it is to stay for the final blessing before leaving church. I mentioned that the Mass is not truly complete without the blessing and dismissal. Those last moments are not just a formality; they remind us that we are being sent out to bring Christ's presence into the world. The final blessing seals the grace we have received and sends us forth as witnesses of God's love.

Recently, someone asked me: Father, when is someone really considered late for Mass? That's a wonderful question, one that helps us think more deeply about what the Holy Mass really means. While the Church doesn't give an exact rule or certain number of minutes to define being late, we have to understand that we must come to worship God with our whole heart and take part in the entire celebration from the opening sign of the cross to the final blessing.

The Mass is one sacred act of worship: we listen to God's Word, we pray together, and we receive the precious gift of the Eucharist. If we arrive a bit late because of something truly unavoidable, the Lord surely understands. But if coming late becomes a habit, or if we often miss important parts of the Mass, especially the liturgy of the word or the liturgy of the eucharist, it's good to take a step back and ask how we can do better. Coming a few minutes early gives us a chance to quiet our hearts, to pray, and to prepare ourselves to meet the Lord. Let us not just attend Mass but be truly present to the mystery of God's love happening before us.

Today, as we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King, we are reminded that Jesus is not just a figure from the past. He is our king, our Lord, and the center of our lives. If we truly believe this, then our Sunday worship should reflect it. We give our best to our King: our time, our reverence, our attention, and our hearts. Think about how we attend a concert or watch a movie. We make sure to arrive early because we don't want to miss a single moment. How much more should we want to be on time for the greatest event on earth, which is the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, where Jesus our King offers Himself for us?

As we honor Christ our king today, let us renew our desire to give Him our very best in prayer, in worship, and in how we live each day. May every Mass we attend be our heartfelt declaration: *Christ, you are my King, my time, and my heart. My life belongs to You.*

The impact of formation into priesthood

When someone asks me what the seminary is, I liken it to a garden bed which takes the seeds of a vocation to the priesthood, plants them in rich and nutritious soil, provides them with the necessary sun, moisture, and darkness so that the seed can grow and bear much fruit. It provides a space to remove the weeds of human weakness and protect the vocation from the buffets of the storms and winds that come with life.

I see this in my own experience of formation. When I began seminary after my four years at the University of Illinois, where I studied chemical engineering, I thought I had my life together and knew a thing or two. What I discovered living with 150 other men was that I was embarking upon a journey to grow in honesty with myself, my heart, and God. One day on retreat, I was telling God I wanted to be a great priest, and He responded, 'then you must know what people are feeling and experiencing.' I told him I did, and He gently corrected me and said, 'to do that, you must know what you are feeling and

experiencing.

I didn't know that I had closed off my heart to love of my neighbor due to all the bullying I encountered in grade school. I was usually angry, but wouldn't let anyone

see it, except when I exploded. I didn't trust people.

In seminary, a space was created to assist me in being honest with myself, my heart and God about the pain and betrayals of life. It gave me a space to avail myself to counseling, spiritual direction and good friendships which helped me grow, heal, and forgive. The beautiful fruit of this time was that I grew in a genuine love for my brother and all who I would be called to serve in the Church as a priest.

It was through the generosity of the Diocese of Joliet faithful that I was able to attend seminary. I invite you to prayerfully ask the Holy Spirit, how he might be inviting you to support our current seminarians in their formation to the priesthood.

God Bless you and be assured of my prayers for you.

ABOUT FR. BORELLO

Fr. Steven Borello is a priest of the Diocese of Joliet currently serving as the Director of Vocations.

Fr. Steven grew up in Glen Ellyn, Illinois, and is the oldest of 4 children.

He attended the University of Illinois in Champaign-Urbana where he studied chemistry and chemical engineering.

While there, he received a call to the seminary to discern the priesthood.

He received his Bachelors in Theology and Masters of Divinity from Mundelein Seminary and was ordained a priest for the Diocese of Joliet in 2011.

He first served as an associate pastor at Notre Dame Parish in Clarendon Hills and was then transferred to Saints Peter and Paul Parish in Naperville in June of 2014.

In August of 2015, he began serving at St. John Vianney College Seminary as a spiritual director, director of human formation, and instructor to over 120 men discerning a priestly vocation.

He returned to the Diocese of Joliet in August 2018 to begin as the Director of Vocations.



ADULT FAITH







In his first pastoral letter "Make," Bishop Ronald Hicks encourages all of us to embrace the calling to make disciples. This means that we are meant to transform people into followers of Christ - people who know, love, and serve Him. But we must first make sure that <u>uve</u> are followers of Christ, so that we are <u>able</u> to share Him with others. How are we to do this? Bishop Hicks provides us with five simple ways:

- moment "when you realize that God is real and not just a theory." Conversion is a change of mind and heart, where we truly believe in Christ and are intentional about following Him.
- 2) Confession: The Sacrament of Confession is God's way of bringing 5) Prayer: This is our way of communicating with God. It is more us back to Him. By going to Confession, we are able to receive Christ's grace and "live freely as beloved children of God."
- 3) Communion: The Eucharist is the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Christ. By receiving the Eucharist "we receive the grace and power to go on mission as [Christ's] disciple-makers."
- 1) Conversion: Bishop Hicks explains that Conversion is a particular 4) Commission: At the end of Mass, we "are sent forth to bring the fruits of the Eucharist to the world." More than just saying that the Mass is over, we are called to live our lives and to do good works in Christ's name.
 - than a chore to check off of a list. It is "the heartbeat of our whole journey to live in union with Jesus." 1 conversion

With Prayer as the unifying bond, Conversion, Confession, Communion, and Commission become a cycle to follow, which

motivates us to preach the Gospel and "to shine the light of the Gospel for all to see." Bishop Hicks writes that we do not need to travel far to do this - that we can share the Gospel with people in our own families, workplaces, and local communities, and, in doing so, make disciples.

In order to do this and make others into disciples, however, we must first make ourselves into disciples. Make time for God - for prayer, for Mass, for the Eucharist. When we make our world centered on God, it becomes easier to live as examples for others to follow. We then can make disciples by "being on fire with love for Jesus," and by sharing that love with others in all that we do.

Contact Governor Pritzker and urge him to VETO SB 1950 – Legalizing Assisted Suicide

At 2.54 AM on October 31, the Illinois State Senate narrowly passed **SB 1950**. The Illinois State House narrowly passed the Bill in the Spring. This Bill is now on the Governor's desk. This is the last chance to stop assisted suicide from becoming law in Illinois.

In Canada, where assisted suicide has been legal since 2016, **1 in 20 deaths are now due to assisted suicide/euthanasia**. Too many are giving up on life under this law.

Please CALL GOVERNOR PRITZKER at 312.814.2121 and inform him:

- People with disabilities, the poor and marginalized fear coercion and abuse under assisted suicide laws.
- Suicide rates increase in states where assisted suicide is legal, especially among veterans.
- There is a possible cost savings to insurance companies as they can provide cheaper lethal drugs instead of lifesaving treatments.


