

From Your Pastor

My dearest parishioners,

Happy New Year!

You might be surprised to hear that greeting now. While the secular new year begins on January 1st, the Church's liturgical new year begins today, on the first Sunday of Advent. So, for us, this marks a fresh beginning, a spiritual reset and a new journey with the Lord.

As we start this new liturgical year, we enter the beautiful and meaningful season of Advent. Many people think Advent is just the countdown to Christmas, but it's really much more. It's a time when the Church invites us to slow down a bit, to reflect, and to prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ. The word *Advent* comes from the Latin word *adventus*, which means *arrival* or *coming*, and it reminds us not only of Jesus' birth in Bethlehem, but also of His promise to come again. So, Advent reminds us to look back with gratitude, and to also look forward with hope.

That brings us to an important question: What makes Advent special for us? Advent stirs up a sense of longing in us, a holy desire for God to be close in our lives. It teaches us to wait not with frustration, but with joy and trust. In a world that keeps telling us to rush, Advent gently tells us to pause. It invites us to look at our hearts, turn back to God, and make room for Christ to come in more deeply. The candles we light each week show that even a little faith can overcome darkness. It tells us that God is not far away, that He is coming, and He draws near to those who watch and wait for Him.

As we begin this new liturgical year, my prayer is that Advent awakens hope in us and renews our spirits. May this season help us open our hearts to God's grace. And as we watch and wait for the Lord, may He find us ready, strong in faith, steady in hope, and shining with His love.

CONFESSION



In his first pastoral letter "Make," Bishop Ronald Hicks encourages all of us to embrace the calling to make disciples. This means that we are meant to transform people into followers of Christ – people who know, love, and serve Him. But we must first make sure that \underline{we} are followers of Christ, so that we are \underline{able} to share Him with others.

How are we meant to do this? Bishop Hicks provides us with five simple ways:

- Conversion: Bishop Hicks explains that Conversion is a particular moment "when
 you realize that God is real and not just a theory." He goes on to explain that it is
 possible to go through the motions of faith, but not really believe. Conversion is a
 change of mind and heart, where we truly believe in Christ and are intentional
 about following Him.
- 2) Confession: The Sacrament of Confession is God's way of bringing us back to Him. Bishop Hicks explains that all of us fall into sin, but Christ's Death and Resurrection overpowered the effects of sin. By going to Confession, we are able to receive Christ's grace and "live freely as beloved children of God."
- 3) Communion: The Eucharist (Holy Communion) is the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Christ. By receiving the Eucharist, we are, quite literally, able to unite ourselves with Christ Himself, and "we receive the grace and power to go on mission as [Christ's] disciple-makers."
- 4) Commission: At the end of Mass, we "are sent forth to bring the fruits of the Eucharist to the world." More than just saying that the Mass is over, we are called to live our lives and to do good works in Christ's name wherever we are.
- 5) Prayer: This is our way of communicating with God. It is more than a chore to check off of a list. It is "the heartbeat of our whole journey to live in union with Jesus."

With Prayer as the unifying bond, Conversion, Confession, Communion, and Commission become a cycle to follow, which motivates us to preach the Gospel and "to shine the light of the Gospel for all to see." Bishop Hicks writes that we do not need to travel far to do this – that we can share the Gospel with people in our own families, workplaces, and local communities, and, in doing so, make disciples.

In order to do this and make others into disciples, however, we must first make ourselves into disciples. Make time for God – for prayer, for Mass, for the Eucharist. When we make our world centered on God, it becomes easier to live as examples for others to follow. We then can make disciples by "being on fire with love for Jesus," and by sharing that love with others in all that we do.

We encourage you to download and read the entirety of Bishop Hick's new pastoral letter, MAKE, to discover how to live as a disciple and help make other disciples in your community.
