



Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God: January 1st

This Solemnity falls on the last day of the Octave of Christmas. The date was decided as a way to **honor the Maternity of the Blessed Virgin Mary**, without whom Christ's birth would not have been possible.

AN <u>OCTAVE</u> IS A PERIOD OF EIGHT DAYS WITHIN THE CATHOLIC CHURCH'S CALENDAR. THIS 8-DAY PERIOD IS A WAY TO EXTEND THE CELEBRATION OF A PARTICULAR SOLEMNITY OR FEAST.

It is through the Blessed Mother that Christ was brought into this world. For this reason, we turn to the Blessed Virgin Mary in prayer to ask for her intercession. Just as Christ's life was made possible through His Blessed Mother, so our prayers might be brought to Christ through her, as well.

From Your Pastor

My dearest parishioners,

I greet you with love and peace in the name of Jesus!

Today we celebrate the feast of the Holy Family. But what does this feast really mean for us? It reminds us that when God became a man, He chose to be part of a real family. Jesus, Mary, and Joseph lived a family life like ours. They experienced happiness and celebrations, but they also faced problems and hard times. In fact, today's Gospel shows us that the Holy Family went through struggles too.

In the Gospel of Matthew, Joseph is told in a dream to take Mary and Jesus and flee to Egypt. Think of their fear and worry: leaving home at night, traveling to a foreign land, not knowing what would happen. Jesus began His life as a refugee. Mary and Joseph had the big responsibility of keeping Him safe, while feeling tired and anxious themselves. Their journey was long and hard, but they trusted God and obeyed Him. When it was safe, they didn't go back to their old home but started again in Nazareth, trusting God's plan.

The Holy Family teaches us that holiness does not mean living life without problems. Rather, it means facing life's challenges with faith, courage, and love. This is a message that speaks powerfully to our own families. Many among us carry burdens: financial strain, illness, misunderstandings, or emotional pain. Some families may feel as though they too are on a long and challenging journey to Egypt, looking for safety, comfort, and peace.

As we honor the Holy Family, let us remember that God understands our struggles because He lived them too. May every home in our parish be full of peace, forgiveness, and prayer. And may Jesus, Mary, and Joseph pray for us, helping our families stay loving, faithful and united, especially when life is hard.

- Pull a name from the jar in the narthex; it will have the date of their Confirmation
- Pray with their name as often as possible with any prayer you prefer (rosary, novena, etc)
- Write them a personal note to be given to them on the day of their Confirmation

Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

As we continue our celebration of the Christmas season, today's feast of the Holy Family invites us to reflect on the gift and calling of family life. The Church calls the family the "domestic church," the place where our faith takes root — and where the stewardship virtue of hospitality begins.

Why is hospitality vital to family life? Because

our homes should be a place of love, welcome, and restoration. We can't expect to grow in prayer, service, or faith if our home atmosphere is disconnected or tense. Though no family is perfect, we must intentionally create homes where everyone feels loved and valued.

Our readings offer practical wisdom. In the Book of Sirach, we hear about the blessings that come when children respect their parents — and when adult children lovingly care for their aging parents. Respect and tenderness build a home filled with unity and peace.

St. Paul's Letter to the Colossians offers even more insight. He reminds us that each family member is "God's chosen one," and urges us to "put on" compassion, kindness, humility, and patience — even when we may not feel like it. These small, daily acts of love foster true hospitality at home, which then extends to the wider community.

The Holy Family, too, knew hardship. As today's Gospel reminds us, they faced danger, displacement, and uncertainty. Yet Mary and Joseph remained faithful, trusting in God's plan. They are powerful intercessors for our own families today. On this feast, may we recommit to making our homes places of love and welcome. Let's honor God through the way we treat each other at home — with patience, forgiveness, and care.




