

## From Our Pastor



Question: Do Catholics always need to receive communion in wafer form, or can it be different kinds of bread?



Answer: In the Roman Rite of the Catholic Church, the most common form for the eucharistic bread is the small white communion "wafer" that is a ubiquitous part of the Catholic Mass. The instructions of the Church have been very specific regarding the make-up of the bread used in the Mass: "The bread used in the celebration of the Most Holy Eucharistic Sacrifice must be unleavened, purely of wheat, and recently made ... it follows therefore that bread made from another substance, even if it is grain, or if it is mixed with another substance different from wheat to such an extent that it would not commonly be considered wheat bread, does not constitute valid matter for confecting the Sacrifice and the Eucharistic Sacrament" (see Redemptionis Sacramentum by the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments, no. 48).

The Church's tradition of using a wheat-based bread is based on the bread that Jesus would have used at the Last Supper and is considered to be an essential part of the "matter" of the Sacrament of the Eucharist. As we consider the question of whether a "wafer" — which is properly called a "host" — should be used, we also must keep in mind that in the Eastern Rites of the Catholic Church, leavened (i.e. "raised") bread is more often used. And so, while the thin, white "wafer" is most commonly used in the Roman Rite of the Church, the full expression of the Catholic tradition does allow for a more substantial form of bread to be used, but the tradition of using a simple wheat bread with no other additions or additives is considered essential. ©LPi

## **Divine Mercy In-Home Ministry**





## A Special Promise of Mercy



"I want to grant a complete pardon to the souls that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion on the Feast of My mercy" (1109).

"Whoever approaches the Fountain of Life on this day will be granted complete forgiveness of sins and punishment" (300).

"The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion will obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment" (699).

## **Extraordinary Graces**

Our Lord is emphasizing, through this promise, the infinite value of Confession and Communion as miracles of mercy. He wants us to realize that since the Eucharist is His own Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity, it is the "Fountain of Life" (300). The Eucharist is Jesus, Himself, the Living God, longing to pour Himself as Mercy into our hearts. Why would Our Lord feel the need to emphasize this? Because so many people do not really understand it. They either see no need to receive Holy Communion, or they receive it simply out of habit. As St. Paul explains in his letter to the Corinthians, they eat the bread or drink the cup of the Lord unworthily, "without recognizing the body of the Lord" (I Cor 11:27 29).


In His revelations to Saint Faustina, Our Lord makes it very clear what He is offering us in Holy Communion and how much it hurts Him when we treat His presence with indifference:

"My great delight is to unite Myself with souls ... When I come to a human heart in Holy Communion, My hands are full of all kinds of graces which I want to give to the soul. But souls do not even pay any attention to Me; they leave Me to Myself and busy themselves with other things. Oh, how sad I am that souls do not recognize Love! They treat Me as a dead object" (1385) ...

"It pains Me very much when religious souls receive the Sacrament of Love merely out of habit, as if they did not distinguish this food. I find neither faith nor love in their hearts. I go to such souls with great reluctance. It would be better if they did not receive Me"(1288) ...

"How painful it is to Me that souls so seldom unite themselves to Me in Holy Communion. I wait for souls, and they are indifferent toward Me. I want to lavish My graces on them, and they do not want to accept them. They treat me as a dead object, whereas My Heart is full of love and mercy. In order that you may know at least some of My pain imagine the most tender of mothers who has great love for her children, while those children spurn her love. Consider her pain. No one is in a position to console her. This is but a feeble image and likeness of My love" (1447).

So, Our Lord's promise of complete forgiveness is both a reminder and a call. It is a reminder that He is truly present and truly alive in the Eucharist, filled with love for us and waiting for us to turn to Him with trust. And it is a call for us all to be washed clean in His Love through Confession and Holy Communion no matter how terrible our sins and begin our lives again. He is offering us a new start.



## SUNDAY, APRIL 7 TH IS DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY!

OUR LORD'S PROMISES ATTACHED TO THE PRAYING OF THE CHAPLET OF DIVINE MERCY AS REVEALED TO ST. FAUSTINA KOWALSKA.



- "The souls that say this chaplet will be embraced by My mercy during their lifetime and especially at the hour of their death." (Diary, 754)
- "When hardened sinners say it, I will fill their souls with peace, and the hour of their death will be a happy one." (Diary, 1541)
- 3. "When they say this chaplet in the presence of the dying, I will stand between My Father and the dying person, not as a just Judge but as a merciful Savior." (Diary, 1541)
- 4. "Whoever will recite it will receive great mercy at the hour of death." (Diary, 687)
- "Priests will recommend it to sinners as their last hope of salvation. Even if there were a sinner
  most hardened, if he were to recite this chaplet only once, he would receive grace from My infinite mercy....I desire to grant unimaginable graces to those souls who trust in My mercy." (Diary,
  687)
- "To priests who proclaim and extol My mercy, I will give wondrous power; I will anoint their words and touch the hearts of those to whom they will speak." (Diary, 1521)
- 7. "The prayer most pleasing to Me is prayer for the conversion for sinners. Know, my daughter, that this prayer is always heard and answered." (Diary, 1397)
- "At three o'clock, implore My mercy, especially for sinners; and, if only for a brief moment, immerse yourself in My Passion, particularly in My abandonment at the moment of agony....I will refuse nothing to the soul that makes a request of Me in virtue of My Passion." (Diary, 1320; also, cf. Diary, 1572)
- 9. "Souls who spread the honor of My mercy...at the hour of death I will not be a Judge for them, but the Merciful Savior." (Diary, 1075)
- 10. "I promise that the soul that will venerate this image (of the Divine Mercy) will not perish." (Diary, 48).... "The two rays denote Blood and Water....These two rays issued from the very depths of My tender mercy when My agonized Heart was opened by a lance on the Cross. These rays shield souls from the wrath of My Father." (Diary, 299)
- 11. "I desire that the Feast of Mercy...be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion (in a state of grace on this day) shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment." (Diary, 699)
- "Through this chaplet you will obtain everything, if what you ask for is compatible with My will." (Diary, 1731)



## From the Sacred Music Office:

I am happy to announce that our long-awaited Rodgers Organ has been installed in the Church. This remarkable instrument will enhance our sacred music at Mass for many years to come! Thank you for your generous contributions and continued support of our sacred music fundraiser. Feel free to stop by the choir area after Mass to take a closer look at the organ.

On behalf of St. Mary Parish, I would like to thank the staff at Triune Music, the organ company that has made our vision a reality. Their expertise, guidance, and unwavering support have been invaluable throughout the entire process. We deeply appreciate their dedication and commitment to ensuring that our new organ was installed to perfection just in time for Easter!

Today, Palm Sunday, marks the beginning of Holy Week. On Monday, March 25th, our St. Mary clergy, along with clergy from other parishes will attend the Chrism Mass at the Cathedral of St. Raymond Nonnatus. The Chrism Mass serves as a reminder of our unity in Christ through Baptism and the sacred anointing facilitated by the ministry of our bishop and his priests. At this Mass, priests, deacons, and representatives from the entire diocese gather around the bishop. The bishop will bless the Holy Oils for use in the coming year. The three oils are; Oil of the Sick, Oil of Catechumens and Sacred Chrism.

The Sacred Triduum begins on the evening of Holy Thursday with the Mass of the Lord's Supper and concludes on Holy Saturday with the Easter Vigil. During these most solemn days of the liturgical year, the Triduum includes numerous rituals. Music plays a significant role in conveying various nuances throughout the entire Triduum. Per the instructions of the Roman Missal, after the Gloria on Holy Thursday, the organ will solely accompany the congregation's singing as well as a few choir pieces. The music will remain somber until we sing the Gloria on Holy Saturday. During the Easter Vigil, there will be a significant change in the music, transitioning to a more jubilant and celebratory tone. We will return to singing Richard Proulx's Mass for the City for the Sanctus, Memorial Acclamation, and Great Amen. On Easter Sunday we will also use James Chepponis' Festival Alleluia for the Gospel Acclamation at the choir Mass. I hope that everyone who joins us for our Easter celebrations will sing the music with great joy and excitement at the Resurrection of Our Lord.

## March 24—Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

Today we celebrate Palm Sunday. As we read about the climax of Christ's mission here on earth, we are reminded that He is the Perfect Steward, a model for us all on our stewardship journey.

Our First Reading, from the prophet Isaiah, portrays a suffering servant. The suffering servant, in many ways, foreshadows what Jesus endured during His passion. Even though He didn't deserve such tortures, He humbly submitted to them. His mis-



sion as a steward was to fulfill His Father's mission. We, too, play a unique role in our Father's mission by bringing souls to Christ. It simply begins with the witness of our lives.

Today's Gospel shares the account of Jesus' last days on earth, and how He lives them says a great deal about how we should be living ours as faithful stewards. Jesus does many things in these last days, and they all revolve around prayer and service — two trademark actions of a good and faithful Catholic. He hosts a Passover meal in which He gives us His Body and Blood in the Eucharist. He intensely prays to His Father. Lastly, He submits to humiliation, torture and death for our sake, calling out to God the Father in His weakest moments. We might not be called to the same type of prayer and service, but we are all called to commit time in daily prayer with our Lord, and to serve our families, churches and neighbors.

As we embark on this Holy week, let us take some time to reflect on the life of Christ as He is our model Steward, and may we strive to imitate Him daily.




