Focus: The Narrow Path

"Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough." This teaching of Jesus is a hard one to wrestle with in a world that is consumed with comfort and luxury. People don't want to hear about sacrifice, denial of self, and teachings that are uncomfortable to preach. Many would rather be able to live their life the way they see fit, while at the same time reaping the rewards that await in heaven.

This form of 'Christianity' where everyone is saved and no work is needed to be done in bringing the Gospel to the ends of the world is a fantasy, and contrary to the Gospel. As much as we may wish for this to be the case, the readings today remind us that following Jesus is about taking up our cross and following him. To be authentic disciples and stewards, we must heed the words of St. Paul to the Hebrews and be willing to subject ourselves to the discipline of the Lord. We must like Jesus be humble, and gladly take up our cross and follow him.

Let us not walk the path that is broad and smooth, with many comforts and luxuries along the way, for this is the

path that leads to destruction. Rather, let us strive to be like the saints and walk the narrow path. which is hard and difficult but leads to life everlasting with the Lord. As stewards, we are called to give of ourselves and to be willing to travel this narrow path. One way to do this is through sacrifice and fasting. Let us take up the practice this week of offering some comfort up to the Lord, to help ourselves better orient to walking the narrow path of life.

Summary

In a world consumed with comfort, no one wants to hear the Gospel message of the narrow path, a path full of sacrifice, self-denial, and carrying one's cross. However, this is the life that God calls his disciples to live, to travel the hard and narrow path following our Lord who waits for us at the end. As we take up practices of self-denial and sacrifice, we become more like lesus and are better suited to travel the narrow path, rather than the broad and easy path of destruction. Humility is not something we accomplish for ourselves. It is a gift for those who strive to enter the narrow gate.

Who is a Lector The person(s) who proclaims the Word of God at Mass and liturgical celebrations. They will be scheduled to proclaim at Mass twice a month.

who is a Commentator - The person who welcomes, leads and motivates the assembly of people towards a faith-filled worship of God. They also lead the Prayers of the Faithful.

Requirements – This ministry requires a person who is of excellent character, serious about the practice of their faith, believes and respects that Sacred Scripture is the Word of God. Be willing to complete a parish formation process and attend workshops and days of prayer.

EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS of HOLY COMMUNION

Who is an - Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion (EMHC) .The person (s) who assist the priest with distributing Holy Communion during Mass. They may also bring Communion to the sick and homebound and give viaticum to the dying.



<u>Requirements -</u> To be an EMHC: Have received the sacrament of Confirmation, be of good moral standing, fully participate in the life of the parish, receive sufficient preparation and instruction.

SACRISTAN MINISTRY

Who is a Sacristan — The Sacristan prepares and oversees the com-

pletion of tasks that are necessary for the celebration of the liturgy. Set-up: the books, vestments, vessels, the bread and the wine; assist during the liturgy; clean-up, put away and lock-up. The work is done "behind the scenes" before the liturgy begins and after it ends.



Requirements Is an adult member of the parish, fully initiated into the Catholic faith, mindful of the presence of God and our call to serve, ability to prepare for the liturgy in a timely way and bring order to the celebration. There will be initial training and ongoing formation.
