

## **RENT ESCROW DURING COVID-19**

## To Escrow Rent

- a. You Must Be Current in Rent you cannot escrow your rent if you are behind in rent in any amount. If you start a case when you are behind in rent, it will likely be dismissed.
- b. **Notify Your Landlord in Writing** Tell your landlord in writing what condition problems you are having in your home. Keep a copy to prove to the court that you told your landlord.
- c. **Wait for Repairs** After telling the landlord, give the landlord reasonable time to make the repairs. Usually this is thirty days. It can be shorter if the repair is an emergency.
- d. You can only start a rent escrow case for conditions issues. You cannot use rent escrow for any other purpose.

## How to Rent Escrow in Franklin County Municipal Court

- · You cannot go to the court to file right now
- You can file by mail. Include:
  - A completed rent escrow application
  - A money order for your rental amount made out to the Franklin County Municipal Court
  - Mail to Franklin Co. Muni. Ct., Escrow Clerk, 375 S. High St, 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor, Columbus, OH 43215
  - Send it by certified mail to make sure that it arrives safely.
- Questions about the court's current process, call 614-645-7420.
- You must continue to mail in your rent every month before it is due.
