Dear Friends.

As summer gives way to autumn, our church enters a special season in the life of faith: *Creationtide*. Christians around the world set aside this time to give thanks for the gift of creation, to reflect on the beauty and fragility of the earth, and to renew our commitment to care for all that God has made.

It is no accident that Creationtide leads us naturally into the celebration of *Harvest*.
