

STAYING CONNECTED

Taken from the service book for Advent Antiphons led by Tim Garrett

The "O Antiphons", also known as "The great Os" are Magnificat antiphons used at Vespers during Advent in Western Christian traditions.

Each antiphon is a name of Jesus, one of his attributes that are mentioned in Scripture.

They are: December 17: O Sapientia (O Wisdom)

December 18: O Adonai (O Lord)

December 19: O Radix Jesse (O Root of Jesse)
December 20: O Clavis David (O Key of David)

December 21: O Oriens (O Dayspring)

December 22: O Rex Gentium (O King of the Nations)

December 23: O Emmanuel (O God With Us)

The first mention of them is by Boethius (AD 480-524).

O SAPIENTIA

O Wisdom (O Sapienta)

O Wisdom, coming forth from the mouth of the Most High, reaching from one end to the other, mightily and sweetly ordering all things: Come and teach us the way of prudence.

"The Spirit of the Lord will rest on him – the Spirit of wisdom and of understanding, the Spirit of counsel and of might, the Spirit of the knowledge and fear of the Lord – and he will delight in the fear of the Lord." $\underline{\text{Isaiah 1 I (2-3)}}$

O Lord (O Adonai)

O Adonai (Lord), and leader of the House of Israel, who appeared to Moses in the fire of the burning bush and gave him the law on Sinai: Come and redeem us with an outstretched arm.



"For the Lord is our judge, the Lord is our lawgiver, the Lord is our king; it is He who will save us. ." Isaiah 33 (22)



Tree of Jesse (O Root of Jesse)

O Root of Jesse, standing as a sign among the peoples; before you kings will shut their mouths, to you the nations will make their prayer: Come and deliver us, and delay no longer.

"A shoot will come up from the stump of Jesse; from his roots a Branch will bear fruit...... In that day the Root of Jesse will stand as a banner for the peoples; the nations will rally to him, and his resting-place will be glorious... <u>Isaiah II (I-3 and I0)</u>

O Clavis David (O Key of David)

O Key of David and sceptre of the House of Israel; you open and no one can shut; you shut and no one can open: Come and lead the prisoners from the prison house, those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death.



" I will place on his shoulder the key to the house of David; what he opens no one can shut, and what he shuts no one can open." <u>Isaiah 22 (22)</u>



O Morning Star (O Oriens)

O Morning Star, splendour of light eternal and sun of righteousness: Come and enlighten those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death.

"The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness—on them light has shined." <u>Isaiah 9(2)</u>

Four Sundays before Christmas the church celebrates the season of Advent. It is a time to reflect about and prepare for the coming of Jesus. We reflect on the truth of His coming as a baby and we prepare our hearts again to welcome Him into the centre of our hearts and lives. And to prepare for His promised return to finally redeem all things.

At Advent the church lights one candle each Sunday to help us in this process. They symbolise 4 truths we hold onto:

- I. Hope. We remember how the many prophesies of the Old Testament about the birth of Jesus were perfectly fulfilled. This gives us confidence to trust God's promises to us. Please reflect on the faithfulness of God and give thanks for it in your prayers. Also pray for people who are really struggling at present with difficult situations, causing their faith to be challenged.
- Peace. Jesus made peace with God available to us when He died on the cross. Please pray that more and more people will learn about this truth. Our church leaders are very busy at this time of the year with services for old and young. Uphold them in your prayers.
- 3. **Joy.** Jesus came that we might have joy and that our joy might be full. Pray for anyone you know personally who needs lifting up and experiencing more joy.
- 4. **Love.** The last candle reminds us of God's love. Spend some time soaking up the truth of the fact that God loves you, then pray for His love to be more real in the darkest parts of His world.
