From the streets of Shenandoah, PA—a town well known for nurturing Bernardine Franciscan vocations—the journey of **Sister Danielle Marie Kubelsky** began. Surrounded by the love of her devout Catholic family and inspired by the Bernardines who taught her at St. Stanislaus Elementary School, young Danielle believed she was called by God to become a Sister.

With her family's encouragement, Danielle jumped at the opportunity to attend the Sisters' high school in Reading, PA. After graduating, she eagerly embarked on her path to Sisterhood. Though her initial dream of nursing was redirected, Sister Danielle embraced education, earning degrees from Alvernia College and Marywood University.

For 66 years, Sister Danielle has embodied the Franciscan spirit of service. Her impact spans generations— from elementary classrooms to college halls, Sister has ignited a love for learning in countless students. As a counselor, she guided young people through life's challenges with wisdom and compassion. Many of her most treasured memories come from her time serving at St. Thomas More Elementary School and Holy Name High School in the Allentown Diocese.

Sister's talents extended beyond the classroom. She served as Alvernia College's registrar, the Congregation's Executive Secretary, and a U.S. Province Leader. Today, Sister coordinates the health benefits and government programs for the Congregation, ensuring that the Sisters and their employees receive the best possible care.

When asked what has given Sister Danielle the drive to work so diligently in all her varied roles, she exclaimed without hesitation: "Living the Gospel is my life, my mission, and my passion!"

The transformative power of faith and service are values that continue to shape the lives of individuals and communities today. These values gracefully and fittingly exemplify Sister Danielle Marie Kubelsky. †

Born in Dom Feliciano, Brazil, the journey of **Sister Lusete Morelli** with the Bernardine Franciscan Sisters began in her childhood. "When I was very young, I would visit the Sisters and bring them cookies that my mother had baked," she recalls fondly. This early connection blossomed, and after finishing high school, Lusete answered God's call to dedicate her life to God as a Bernardine Franciscan Sister.

After earning a BS degree in Education & Guidance and a postgraduate degree in Pastoral Theology, Sister Lusete's ministry became diverse and far-reaching. For over 39 years, she worked in the schools, directed the Sisters' formation program, served as a member of the Provincial Council, and ministered as a missionary in the Dominican Republic.

Today, Sister is working in the heart of the Amazon where she encounters her greatest joys and challenges. "We support 13 communities," she explains. "Our mission involves religious instruction, Sacrament preparation, migrant pastoral care, and the training of leaders and catechists."

The challenges are significant. Communities are spread far apart, and the furthest mission is 139 miles away. The dirt roads are impassable during the rainy season, yet Sister Lusete faces these obstacles with unwavering determination. "My greatest reward," Sister remarks, "is serving a community of simple, welcoming people, who are eager and ready to embrace God's love." Trusting in God's loving Providence, Sister Lusete continues each day to form deep and beautiful communities of faith. Indeed, the legacy of our first missionary Sisters, who arrived in Brazil in 1937, lives on through the ministry of Sister Lusete Morelli. †

As a religious US-based organization, the Franciscan Federation is a diverse group of Franciscans who seek a deeper understanding and love of the Franciscan movement in our world today through collaboration.

Sister Sandra has been an integral part of the Franciscan Federation for 16 years where she was a member, and then chairperson of the regional Steering Committee. In 2012 Sister was invited to serve on the Federation's Justice, Peace and Integrity of Creation Committee.

Originally from Wisconsin, Sister Sandra has been a Bernardine for nearly 60 years. After working as a nurse and then midwife for the first 25 years of her religious life, Sister spent three years teaching nursing to young women in Romania. Upon her return, Sister became the Director of Justice, Peace, and Earthcare for the Bernardine Franciscan Sisters. In addition, she was appointed Director of Bernardine Center, a food pantry and soup kitchen in Chester, PA—a job she holds to this day.

As a current member of the Congregational Leadership Team, Sister Sandra is the Assistant to the Congregational Minister.

"These involvements," Sister remarked, "have not only enhanced my leadership skills in serving God's people, but have also, and more importantly, deepened my experience of Franciscan Gospel living."
