🔼 MONDAY: BOURKE (BD)


Tour Start Time 10.00am

Our adventure along the Darling River Run begins today as we depart from the vibrant city of Dubbo and make our way to the historic river town of Bourke. We pause in Nyngan, a friendly river town where red earth meets big sky. Built on agriculture and the goldrush of the 1800s, Nyngan sits on the edge of the tranquil Bogan River, the gateway to the 'Great Outback' beyond. Enjoy café fare or a classic bakery lunch, then stroll the shady levee by the Bogan River to un-crinkle the knees. Snap a pic at the Big Bogan if you fancy, soak up the country charm. (Lunch own expense.) We then continue onto Bourke where we take the time to visit the town's historic cemetery. Here, we'll honour the legacy of the celebrated Professor Fred Hollows and reflect on inscriptions that tell stories of bushrangers, drovers, cameleers, riverboat men and lost children.

🔧 TUESDAY: BOURKE AND BREWARRINA (BLD)

We start the day with a visit to the historic town of Brewarrina, home to the ancient Fish Traps, often called the "Oldest Manmade Structure in the World." Viewing these remarkable traps depends on the river levels. After exploring the Aboriginal Cultural Museum, we'll return to Bourke, once a bustling hub of wool, cotton, and citrus production. We'll enjoy lunch before visiting the Back O' Bourke Exhibition Centre. In the afternoon, we'll board the paddle steamer PV Jandra for a cruise(subject to river levels), offering a glimpse into the Darling River's storied past.





Our journey down the iconic Darling River begins with a relaxing morning tea, surrounded by the breathtaking beauty of the river and its everchanging landscape. As we follow the river downstream, we'll stop to take in a few hidden gems along the way before arriving in the charming outback town of Louth for a delightful lunch. After an insightful tour of Louth, rich with history and character, we continue on to our destination for the next two nights—Trilby Station, a working sheep station where the spirit

of the outback comes to life.

After breakfast we'll visit the historic Dunlop Station, which was originally over a million acres for morning tea and a tour of the historic shearing shed, that was the first shed in the world to complete a mechanical shearing back in 1888. Back to Trilby for lunch and this afternoon we embark on a discovery tour of Trilby with Liz Murray. Trilby Station is a 320,000 acres property, running Merino sheep and an extensive goat enterprise. The Murray family can trace their settlement on the Darling River near Louth back seven generations to 1860.



FRIDAY: TRILBY/MENINDEE (BLD)

This morning, our journey resumes as we return to Louth and follow the scenic route along the East side of the Darling River, pausing for a delightful morning at one of the best pubs in the outback, Tilpa Pub. Our path then leads us to Wilcannia, once hailed as the "queen of the west," boasting impressive sandstone structures and a pivotal role in the 1800s as a bustling port for paddle steamers. Today, it stands as a vital service center for the rural population.

Continuing our exploration along the West side of the Darling River, we head towards Menindee with lunch en-route. We visit Copi Hollow, part of the Menindee Lakes System, offering a picturesque setting. In the afternoon, a Wetlands Cruise beckons, allowing us to delve into the beauty of the Lakes. The day concludes with dinner at the charming Maiden's Hotel, promising an enriching blend of history, nature, and local hospitality.

SATURDAY: MENINDEE/MILDURA (BL)

We depart from Menindee and head to the charming village of Pooncarie for a peaceful morning tea break. This historic river port invites you to slow down, chat with the welcoming locals, and perhaps spot a few kangaroos along the serene riverbank. From there, we continue our journey toward Mildura, with a delightful and unexpected lunch stop along the way. Once we arrive in Mildura, dinner is yours to enjoy, with tempting options such as Stefano de Pieri's acclaimed restaurant or The Province by Matt De Angelo, where you can savor fine local cuisine.







Today we enjoy the day at Mungo. Embark on a journey to the World Heritage Listed Mungo National Park, where a mesmerizing landscape of ancient dry lake basins and intricate sand formations awaits. Mungo is not just a place; it's a living testament to the rich Aboriginal history embedded in the heart of New South Wales, holding profound significance for the local indigenous people as the sacred home of Mungo Woman and Mungo Man.

Immerse yourself in the awe-inspiring scenery surrounding the Walls of China, a distinctive feature nestled on the southeastern fringe of the Lake Mungo lunette. This natural wonder stands as one of Australia's most indelible sights, captivating all who lay eyes on it. Today promises a journey of genuine wonder and discovery, offering a profound connection to the ancient tales woven into the fabric of Mungo National Park.

MONDAY: MILDURA/WENTWORTH/BROKEN

After breakfast, our journey takes us to Broken Hill via Wentworth with a stop at the junction of where the mighty Darling and Murray Rivers meet offering a tour of this quaint gem nestled beside Australia's two mightiest rivers. Upon arrival in Broken Hill, unwind, have some lunch (own expense) and contemplate the enriching seven days of discovery across this expansive Australian terrain. This afternoon we will explore Broken Hill and finish the day with a sunset at the Sculpture Symposium
