GENERAL INFORMATION

REGISTRATION:

Conference wristbands and lunch tickets will be given out Thursday and Friday before the conference at school. Wristbands must be worn for entry into the event, and at all times throughout the day. Lunch tickets will be required to redeem for boxed lunches, and no day-of substitutions will be possible.

COST:

Registration is \$45 per person and includes lunch. Payment can be found on the Gulf Bank Site under "NOLA Youth Conference." Payment is due by midnight on Monday, September 8.

LUNCH:

Boxed lunches from Honey Baked Ham are included in the cost of the event. Participants will have a choice between: ham sandwich, turkey sandwich, chicken salad sandwich, California veggie sandwich, or vegetarian Cobb salad. Ms. Lannan will get your lunch option after payment is received.

LIABILITY FORMS:

Each student must have a completed Chapelle permission slip, which will be emailed to parents after payment has been received. These forms are due to Ms. Lannan by Monday September 9.

TRANSPORTATION:

Students are responsible for finding their own transportation to and from the event. Carpooling is recommended! If students drive, limited parking is available on-site, and will be first come, first served on the day of the event. Once on-site parking is at capacity, groups should utilize street parking around Jesuit. Chapelle will meet in front of the gym at Jesuit at 8:45am. Parents, please call Ms. Lannan if you have any trouble locating our group (251-510-8627). Ms. Lannan will also create a groupme to communicate to the girls where to meet the morning of the event.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

- Dress code is casual/comfortable, but please dress modestly and wear appropriate dress for the day. Please also keep in mind that we will attend both Mass and Adoration as part of the event. Dress must be in line with Chapelle "white dress down" rules.
- Participants are expected to remain on Jesuit High School grounds at all times for the duration of the event.
